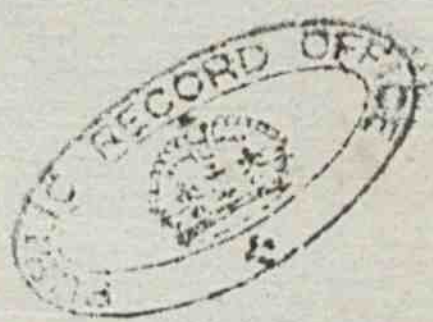

GENERAL REMARKS.

In addition to the cases stated in the preceding pages, several others occurred on the voyage, chiefly, though not all among the Children; which as they showed nothing particular, I have considered it unnecessary to insert. These were for the most part Bowel complaints as Diarrhoea among the Children from change and too full diet; or Constipation and slight feverishness, the sequelae of sea sickness and want of due exercise, among the men or more commonly the women. We had also a few cases of Catarrh, combined in one or two instances with a good deal of pulmonary irritation or congestion requiring the use of the Linctus Latically. At Lachine, one or two of the children were attacked with chin cough in a mild form; the contagion being no doubt derived from Surgeon Powers's party, which we found there in Barracks on our arrival. All communication between the parties was forbid, but the People rather courted it, saying the sooner their children had it over the better. In proceeding up the River in the Batteries one or two of the Children had slight attacks of Cholera; some of the Women were feverish for a day or so from exposure to the weather; and three or four Men, the consequence of being now up to the middle in the River, now exposed to a burning Sun, were ailing, Headach, thirst and Bowel complaints for a few days. There was nothing however in any of these cases worthy of remark. Our most sickly times were, at sea about the middle of June when we had 20 persons on the Sick List besides several more trifling complaints, the consequence I conceived of much stormy and wet weather and the unavoidable confinement of the People below: and at Lachine, where on the day of our arrival five cases of Fever, Diarrhoea and Dysentery were put on the list and one or two afterwards, besides several cases of minor importance, the consequence no doubt of the great heat (Therm: 88° to 92° and 96°) and the indulging in Milk diet, drinking Beer and eating quantities of unripe fruit. They were however relieved over to Mr. Meade in a very healthy state, only three being on the Sick list, and these convalescent. The fatigue, privations and exposure unavoidable while proceeding up the River, seemed to have no real injurious effect on the health at the time; owing probably to the constant state of excitement and exercise, and the elevated hopes and anticipations they might have formed of future comfort, from the pleasing prospects of plenty and happiness they every where pursued around them.

We were supplied with vaccine matter from the Navy Board, which I believe failed in every instance. Eighteen persons were tried in the John Barry without success. Three of these had been previously vaccinated in the Elizabeth by Surgeon Powers with the same result. The matter had been probably too long kept and was certainly very insufficiently put up, being deposited between two pieces of common glass, presenting to each other plane surfaces and wrapped in a single fold of common Paper.

The quantity of matter originally deposited appeared to me to have been exceedingly minute, as I could scarcely at any time perceive a vestige of it on the glass.

During the greater part of the passage we had unfortunately very disagreeable weather: The prevailing winds blew from the N.W. with much rain and thick fog: so that for days together the deck was very close and damp. Notwithstanding every means to the contrary; as constant attention to cleanliness, ventilation and fumigation.

In the River about 200 miles below Quebec the ship got on shore in a thick fog and remained nearly 18 hours. Some of the Emigrants became very unruly: and nothing but perseverance in the Officers, and the manly and good conduct of many of the Emigrants, preserved the ship from total wreck; saved the stores and probably some lives.

As the service on which we have been lately employed is peculiar, I hope the Board will excuse me, for proposing a few alterations in the Medicines and Medical stores supplied to each ship, in case a future Emigration should take place. I would propose leaving out altogether the following Medicines —

Ammoniaci Gummi. Acidum Nitricum Dilutum. Ceratum Resinae. Cetaceum. Extractum Conii. Guaiaci Resina. Hydrag. Nitric. Oxyd. Prop. Hydrag. Oxymerc. Lini Semina. Quassiae Lignum.

The quantity of Mgt. Hyd. fort might be reduced to ℥ss. I would beg leave to propose an increase of the following Medicines: Antimonii Tartarizati ℥ij. Magnesia Sulphatis ℥ss. ℥xxij. Ol. Ricini ℥ij. Ol. Terbinthina ℥ij. Semen Foliorum ℥viij. Tinct. Opii ℥ij. Tinct. Scilla ℥ij. Vini Antimonii ℥ij.

In the Medical comforts an exchange of Sago for Arrow root would be most advisable, as the Emigrants neither know how to prepare the former, nor when taught will they take the trouble: nor indeed is there proper convenience for cooking. The Arrow root is, on the other hand prepared in an instant. On the passage out a Canister was supplied me by the Master of the ship. I prepared it for them myself. They relished it and were thankful. He also supplied me with several Bottles of wine for the sick: and I should ^{propose} a supply on any future occasion, of not less than one Dozen of Sound Port wine to each ship.

Besides these things, there was among my Party, a great want of Soap, a most necessary article where cleanliness is so necessary, notwithstanding it is to be got so cheap in Ireland. Previous to leaving Cork, we subscribed and procured 80lbs, which was served out on the passage. I should therefore propose that a small supply be put on Board each ship, and be served at the discretion of the Surgeon Superintending.

There might probably be other alterations proposed, but as the Medicines and stores are left in the Colony, those untouched on the passage afterwards become necessary; and of several very necessary articles, as may be seen from the reports of last Expedition, there will

in a short time be a great deficiency; and to provide in some measure against that occurrence in future, I have taken the liberty to propose the few preceding alterations
