At Prime Minister's Questions today I asked you why you had not disclosed to Sir Anthony Hammond's inquiry the fact that you were a guest of the Hinduja brothers at a private dinner party at their London home just six months before your Government awarded a passport to G.P. Hinduja.

In so far as I was able to hear your answer, I believe you indicated that I should refer any such complaint to "the appropriate authorities". Since Sir Anthony Hammond's inquiry has now been completed, it is not clear to me which "authorities" you had in mind when making your response.

Would you please, therefore, indicate to me the identity of the authorities to which you were referring and I shall then follow your recommendation.

STATEMENT BY KEITH VAZ MP

I was surprised that Andrew Lansley MP had chosen to write to Elizabeth Filkin, Parliamentary Commissioner for Standards, about my wife's company, Mapesbury Communications Limited.

Mr Lansley should be aware from the evidence published by the Committee on Standards and Privileges last week that I sought advice from the Registrar of Mcmber's Interests and the then Parliamentary Commissioner for Standards, Sir Gordon Downey, whether or not there was a requirement to register the company (attachment to Annex 39 of the evidence). They confirmed that this was not necessary. I have never received any benefits or payments from Mapesbury..

Mr Lansley also refers to a lecture by the Sindhi philosopher, Swani Vaswami, in June 1995. I have today written to the Chairman of the Standards and Privileges Committee and seen Mrs Filkin, to confirm that Mapesbury undertook the public relations work for this non-profit making lecture in return for reimbursement of costs only. These costs were met by the Hinduja Foundation, which is a registered charity. There was no benefit to Mapesbury, to any member of my family, or to me personally.
