Letter from the Prime Minister of Grenada

Thank you for your letter of 3 January enclosing an invitation to the Prime Minister to attend Grenada's 25th Anniversary Independence celebrations. This reply has been delayed slightly to take account of the outcome of the General Election in Grenada on 18 January.

We recommend that the Prime Minister declines
Dr Mitchell's invitation. Although this is clearly an
important event for the people and Government of Grenada,
it does not warrant the attendance of the Prime Minister.
But a letter from the Prime Minister would certainly be
appropriate, and would give a lot of pleasure locally.

To the surprise of many, Prime Minister Dr Keith Mitchell's New National Party (NNP) managed to win all 15 seats on 18 January. Although the overwhelming result has raised concerns about the implications for the plurality of the Grenadan democratic process, Mitchell has given encouraging assurances that he will include trade unions and NGOs in the consultation process, particularly on issues of national importance.

The enclosed draft includes a congratulatory message.
