- 2. Since the December review only three letters to Mrs. Lizy HONIGMANN @ PHILBY have been intercepted and none of these has been of special security interest. Although HONIGMANN is known to have been a Russian spy there is no evidence over the last six months to suggest that she is in contact with any current R.I.S. suspects in the UK.
- 3. It is therefore requested that this H.O.W. now be cancelled. K.3/PMW concurs.

When I told you about the information at 167a, that it was reported that Lizzy PHILBY was jobless, had resigned from the Communist Party and might be becoming disillusioned, you asked me to look at the file (PF.47,579) for John PEET, as there were perhaps signs of similar disillusionment in his case and Maurice Williams had written a note having some bearing on this.

- 2. Maurice's note is at 280b in PEET's file. It recommends us to be very wary of the report of PEET's disillusionment, but sets out reasons why his case should be considered of K Branch interest. In this connection please see minute 290 in his file.
- 3. While it is true that we should be suspicious of any change of heart on the part of PEET, Ian Cameron's idea as at 292a of de-briefing Colin MacINTYRE more thoroughly seems a good one and we might now write to him again to see how he has progressed with this. There is just a possibility that MacINTYRE might provide a lead in to PEET and through PEET to Lizzy.
- 4. An interesting point is that PEET seems this year to have broken his habit of visiting the U.K. (see paragraph 4 of 280b), and this year went to Varna (Bulgaria), all of which is mentioned in his mother's letter at 296a. (She seemed perhaps a little sad about it, and suggested he might get away again in November). It might be that he had some sort of warning about the MacINTYRE report and changed his plans voluntarily; alternatively some form of pressure may have been put upon him from the Communist side.

While I was looking through this file I came across the letter from Lizzy PHILBY at 163a and there are two points in it which I think we should extract to other files. There is in the first place a reference to the "Sanchas" who I feel sure must be a reference to the family of the Spaniard (whose full name escapes me at the moment) whose file you looked at at the time you were doing your analysis of HEFTER. Secondly, the ALBERMANS mentioned half way through the letter is without doubt the family who live in Highgate in the next door house to TALKATIVE's sister-in-law. If I remember rightly Mrs. ALBERMAN is the granddaughter of ZWEIG and possesses a great number of his papers. This is allegedly the reason for the contact between TALKATIVE and the ALBERMANS because as you will recall TALKATIVE has written a book on ZWEIG. I am pretty sure, however, that there is something on record which this letter confirms to show that there was a pre-war connection between Lizzy PHILBY and the ALBERMANS.

There should be a note of all this on - time Sah TALKATIVE's file by Hugh Galton-Fenzi who dug up F grander this information fairly recently.



Donald McCOMMICK @ Richard DEACON, author of "A History of the Russian Secret Service" (published Muller, 1972), "A History of the British Secret Service" (published Muller, 1969) and many other books was interviewed twice in Room 055 by K3/E W Pratt using the name Pavitt and myself using the name Rimmer.
- 2. The purpose of the interviews was to attempt to get mccorfor to tell us about his sources for "A History of the Russian Secret Service" and in particular to try to discover whether he had any information new to us about the origins and methods of the RIS attack on this country in the 1930s, with particular reference to various assertions he makes in the chapter entitled "Infiltration" (Chapter 22).

KRIVITSKY and Lizy PULLBY

33. We asked McCORMICK on what he based his assertion that "KRIVIISKY knew all about PHILDY because it was in Vienna where he and PHILDY both met their future wives and all four were members of the same underground Communist cell in that city", (page 307). His reply was:-

"I comnot find any further notes or references to a link between KRIVITSKY and PHILDI's first wife, Lissy PHIEDMARK, yet I am sure there was a link, and that it was in Vienne."

He was not able to enlarge on this.



#### Lizi PHILBY

22. I went on to ask LEES about Kim's marriage to Lizi, (PF 68,261) whether he was surprised by the marriage and whether Lizi was the sort of person he would have expected Kim to marry. He replied that as Kim had told him it was only a marriage of convenience he had not been particularly surprised by it. He knew that Kim and Lizi had been heavily involved in smuggling wanted people out of Austria, and he assumed that things had got too hot for Lizi and Kim had married her to get her out. LEES said he did not think that Kim and Lizi had much in common and Kim had told him later that after Lizi left him she became a prostitute. I asked if Kim had in fact ever brought Lizi to Nottingham to stay with him but LEES said "No". He had only met Lizi once in London in 1936 (see paragraph 33).

30. I showed LEES the incomplete letter of his to Guy of 20th July, 1936, from which it appears that he was intending to visit Guy and Kim in London with a friend called STEWART.

- 33. Before the visit LEES had written to Kim telling him they were coming up to London and asking if they could see him. Kim had replied that he would be in Berlin that week but would be flying back and they must lunch with him on the Saturday. Guy, STEWART and LEES had all gone for lunch to the flat where Kim and Lizi were living. LEES could not remember the address but when I suggested the Kilburn area he thought that was right. This was the only occasion on which he had met Lizi and his main memory of her was that she could not cook; the meat for lunch had been red raw and almost inedible.
- 34. LEES said that the Spanish Civil War had just broken out and the conversation at lunch concerned the war. He remembered being very angry when Kim said that the leftists in Spain did not have a chance, but Kim was not prepared to pursue the argument and left it in the air. LEES recalled that PHILBY was working at the time for a German trade magazine and appeared to be almost pro-Nazi in his sympathies. I asked what Lizi's attitude to this appeared to be and LEES replied that he thought she was ambivalent. When he heard later from Kim that Lizi had left him, however, he assumed this was partly because she did not agree with his politics.
- 35. When I asked how Guy had appeared to get on with Lizi LEES replied "Guy never took very much notice of women." He could not remember noticing anything particular about their attitude to each other.

(Comment: Guy appears to have been on very friendly terms with Lizi in 1937 when she wrote a letter to him inviting him to visit her in Paris. I was hoping LEES might have some useful comment on the extent of their relationship at this earlier period.)

#### Note for File

Lizy HONIGHANN was born KOHLMANN in Vienna in 1910. She first married an Austrian called FRIEDMANN, from whom she was soon divorced, and it was as Lizy FRIEDMANN that PHILBY met her in Vienna in 1933/34. He lodged in her house and in February, 1934 they married. By the marriage she obtained British nationality and travelled to the U.K. with PHILBY a month or two later. It was almost certainly through Lizy that PHILBY was recruited by the R.I.S. and they worked together for that organisation for some years. Lizy was also an active member of the Communist Party in England during the war. By about 1940 she and PHILBY had separated and they were divorced in 1946. Lizy then lived with HONIGMANN, whom she later married, either before or after their return to Eastern Europe in 1946. Since that date she has been living in East Germany. It is not known whether she still works for the R.I.S. and there have been reports that she is disillusioned both with the Russians and the East German regime, but in the absence of any firm information it is presumed that contact with her could still indicate connection with espionage.

#### Note For File

- Reference 198z and 199a, Home Office papers for Mrs Magda BALINT show that she was born Budapest on 5th May, 1910 nee GRUNWALD. Her husband, Dr Istvan BALINT, died in Russia in January, 1943. Early in 1957 she was invited to come and live in England by a cousin who was a naturalised British subject. She came out without difficulty and has been here ever since and has obtained her naturalisation. There is only one item of possible security interest in her Home Office files, namely that in 1958 she was the subject of a denunciation by another Hungarian refugee. The substance of the denunciation does not appear on her file however, nor any details of her accuser, except that the name he adopted in this country was HOWE. Papers about this were formerly in D2/Gen.H.383/KT (there was correspondence with S.B. in June, 1960) of which there is now no trace and L.521-Hungarians which was destroyed on 30.10.68.
- 2. Since I wrote the note at 199a and the arrival from the Home Office of Mrs Magda BALINT's files, we have had the immigration reports at 202a and 204a reporting the departure of the CSAKANYs from this country. Gyorgy CSAKANY said that while in London he had been staying at the home of a Hungarian friend whom he named as 'Miss Mander'. It would seem, therefore, that his hostess was not Mrs Magda BALINT, as I thought, but Miss Magda Clara MENDE, the other occupant of the flat at 100 Forset Court. She is N.T. in our records and her Home Office file shows that she was naturalized British in 1963. She was born at Vac, Hungary, on 11.1.09. She left Hungary quite easily in 1957 to join some relatives here, said she had never been a member of the C.P. in Hungary and does not appear to be of any security interest She is employed as a book-keeper in London.
- 3. The presumed host of the younger Gyorgy CSAKANY, however, living at 39 Christchurch Avenue, namely Martin PAPAI, is the subject of quite an interesting file, PF 872,125.
- first came to notice in 1966, three years after his naturalisation as a British subject, when his name appeared on the list of emigres kept by the Hungarian Consulate for invitation to functions of the Hungarian Cultural Circle in He and his wife became members of the Circle and by 1968 he was working for it, keeping the books etc. In 1969 reported that he was hoping to return home to Hungary. According to a K5B source he is a long standing Communist activist who had been a Party member in Hungary for eighteen years before coming here in 1957. Some of these years had been spent in the illegal Communist underground prior to 1945. He had worked as head porterr of the Imperial Hotel in Budapest to report on visitors. After the events of 1956 his tough hard-line views conflicted with the newer line of the Party and he was told he could go to the West if he wished. He came here with the full knowledge and approval of the Party. He visited Hungary in 1966, 1967 and 1969 and was re-admitted to the Party in Hungary of which he is now a He participates fully in the activities and intrigu full member.

Miss Palliser drew my attention to the attached letter from Lizy PHILBY to Gerda NEWMARK dated 10th January 1969 filed at 163a in PF.68,261 containing a reference to the SANCHAS. The letter undoubtedly refers to Alicia Mariblanca SANCHA the daughter of Jose and Anelia SANCHA who lived in East Germany (Wildensteiner Strasse 20, Berlin) from 1959-1967 when they went to Spain. Alicia Mariblanca came to the U.K. in June 1968 and was given permission to stay until July 1969 to attend art clases at Wimbledon Technical College. The fraffic Index shows that she was out of the U.K. from 14th December 1968 to 16th January 1969 which accords with the information in Lizy's letter. The reference to the brother obviously refers to Alan SANCHA who is still living in East Germany and is in very poor health. 3. 45. We asked whether Betty SHIELDS-COLLINS had had a Secretary either in Geneva or in Paris, and if so whether he had known her.

#### COMMENT

In asking these questions we were expecting that the answer might be Joan Home PEEL, now Brain SIMON's wife (vide Comment following paragraph 18). We do not know when Joan started working for Betty; our earliest indication that she was doing so refers to 1938 when she is reported as having discharged Betty's duties in Paris when the latter attended a W.S.A. Youth congress at Vassar College, New York State, U.S.A.

46. HENDERSON said that so far as he recalled Betty did not have her own Secretary in Paris, but he had known a girl who had worked in KLUGMANN's office who had helped Betty with typing and other secretarial tasks. We asked her name; he told us it was Lucie HALPERN. She had told him that she had had an Austrian/Jewish father and a Spanish mother both of whom had suffered - indeed died - at the hands of the Fascists. She had been bitterly anti-Fascist; she had probably been a Communist.

COMMENT

Lucie, in the course of the last few years, has been interviewed by the French authorities on a number of occasions. From our point of view in the light of the reports we have received there seem to be certain areas where she could be questioned in greater detail. As a result of what we have learnt from recent U.R.G. research into Comintern activities in Paris at that time, we would have a number of questions about these we would like the French to ask her; we would obviously also like to know who, apart from HENDERSON, her friends were there, and whether for example, she had known her Viennese contemporary Lizzy PHILBY (She was of course in Beruit during the time Kim PHILBY was there).

59. Before leaving the subject of Paris we asked if the following addresses meant anything to him:

Note on the 1937 Weekend House Party at the PHILEY Cottage in Wales

Five persons have been questioned about this occasion - (PF.151,242), Andrew D'ANTAL (PF.47,180), Heinz ROLAND (PF.749,778), Gerda NEWMARK (PF.49,307), and Friedl CALDER (PF.66,317), all of whom were certainly present at the cottage.

- 2. There is a consensus that the date was the Whitsun weekend of May 1937, coinciding with the Coronation of George VI.
- 3. Putting together the testimony of the five persons questioned a total of eight persons have been identified as having been present, viz:-

Heinz ROLAND

Unidentified man "X"

Nobody has ever suggested that Friedl CALDER's sister Lissy MENZIES was present.

One of the CALDER group snaps was probably taken on the same day NEWMARK picture of the three girls as they are wearing identical clothes in every detail. The CALDER photographs raise the question of whether there was a ninth person at the cottage as they include all the eight known to have been there. They could have been taken with a self-timer but this would require a tripod and one would expect somebody to have remembered this slightly unusual technique having been used. Alternatively they may have enlisted the aid of some more or less casual visitor to photograph the whole group together. The only person who appears to have been asked positively who took these photographs was ROLAND who said he could not remember. has not been shown the group photographs or asked about the identity of "X" since we have obtained a photograph of him. This would seem the obvious outstanding action. Note on interview with Dr. Henry ROLAND at Room 055 on 13 April, 1970.

Dr. ROLAND telephoned Room 055 at about 10.00 a.m. on 13 April in response to the letter and it was arranged that he should come for interview at 4.00 p.m. the same day. He did not ask what the interview was about.

Without any further prompting ROLAND said that his knowledge of PHILBY was limited to a weekend he had spent at PHILBY's cottage in Wales in, he thought, 1933, 1934 or 1935 (it was in fact 1937). He said that the invitation had come through the NEWMARKS who were members of his "circle" and he proceeded to tell me who the NEWMARKS were and are. The others present at the cottage - it was a "long" weekend, either Easter or Whitsun - had been Andrew D'ANTAL, whose background he also described; a girl called Friedl who was either German or Austrian, who had married an American diplomat, and who had a sister, Lissy. who married Lord LATHAM, former Head of London Transport; V when I mentioned the whom he later agreed was and a man called surname). He recollected that someone had had a red Singer sports car though he was not sure whether he travelled down in this or in a little Austin he possessed at the time. - nu frost of file At this stage I showed ROLAND the photographs (provided by Friedl CALDER) taken during the weekend. He was naturally intrigued with these and asked who had taken them. I said that several members of the group had copies and I was not sure who had provided these. He identified seven members of the group without difficulty but appeared at a loss over the unidentified man whom he did not seem to remember as having been present at all. He reacted at once when I suggested the name Julius STRAUSS, saying that he knew STRAUSS well - he was Frankfurt born and is a member of the stockbroking firm of STRAUSS, TURNBULL and Co. He had been a member of his circle but he was sure he had not been at the weekend in Wales and he did not resemble the man in the picture. He was now "bald and ugly": I pointed out that the pictures were taken over thirty years ago but he still could not equate STRAUSS with the man in the picture. He said that if it had not been for the photographs he would not have remembered this man as having been present at all and he had no idea who he was or where he fitted into the party. He was prepared to show the photograph to STRAUSS if I wished but he was sure it was not him. I mentioned the suggestion that the man had been a Persian (see Friedl CALDER's account). ROLAND made no immediate comment to this but later on, when just about to go, he asked whether there had been any particular significance in my reference to a Persian. I said no - it was simply the recollection of one member of the party. In his subsequent note returning the photograph (see serial 54a) he says that he believes "the suggestion that it was someone from the Iran Embassy is correct", and adds that it is certainly not Julius STRAUSS. One wonders whether this is not an attempt to throw us off the scent. I did not mention the Persian Embassy though I did say half-jokingly at some stage that we wondered whether it might have been someone from the Russian Embassy.

5. The only person ROLAND thought might conceivably be able to help (by this time I had hinted that we had tried all the other members of the group except Lizy PHILBY) was one Joe AVRACH, a former B.B.C. employee who was now free-lancing and who had been a slightly later recruit to their circle. AVRACH's address was 7 Braxted Park, Streatham. He described AVRACH as "from Poland or Berlin".

- Andrew D'ANTAL (PF 47,180) said that he thought the unidentified man may have been a Jewish stockbroker called Julius STRAUSS who was a friend either of ROLAND or of the NEWMARKS.
- (2) AVRACH is N.T. in Registry but he is evidently known to have been a member of the NEWMARK circle as his name was put to D'ANTAL when the latter was interviewed in October, 1968. (33c) D'ANTAL described AVRACH as a painter and a friend of ROLAND's, but also connected with the B.B.C. He had been born in the part of Poland which was Russian at that time but was to all intents and purposes a Berliner.
- 6. Reverting to the photographs I asked ROLAND if he could remember who had taken them, as unless they were taken with a delayed-action shutter there must have been a ninth person present. He was unable to assist at all on this.
- Recapitulating the story of the weekend ROLAND confirmed that he had come in on it as a friend of NEWMARK and D'ANTAL and he had not previously met Lizy or Kim PHILEY. Some time after the weekend incident he had met both the PHILEY's at their flat in London but this was the extent of his acquaintance. He remembered Kim PHILEY as intelligent and charming but a heavy drinker even in those days. He asked me whether Lizy had been "involved" and I confirmed that she had. He did not seem surprised. His only other comment about PHILEY was that he had been surprised to read that he had never learnt Russian, but I think he said this to bring out the point that he (ROLAND) had taught himself Russian in a short space of time. I did not pursue this or try to draw him . out on his visits to the U.S.S.R.
- 8. ROLAND volunteered at some stage that the members of his circle were "very left" in view of what was happening in Germany at the time he said this was the only possible standpoint for anyone of conscience. They were all "respectable" now. He remembered arguing with Edward NEWMARK at the time of "he Ribbentrop-Molotov Pact which as far as he ROLAND was concerned was the end of everything. NEWMARK had defended Russia at that time but he had mellowed (or words to that effect) with the achievement of material success. He described NEWMARK as being not in the same intellectual class as D'ANTAL. He mentioned that NEWMARK had met hizy PHILBY on at least one occasion since the war in the course of visiting the Leipzig Fair and he wondered if we knew this. I said that I believed we did.



I saw Andrew Louis D'ANTAL yesterday, the 8th December, and as requested by you showed him the photograph (attached) of Jennifer Fisher WILLIAMS, and asked him if by any chance the "ginger haired woman" who was connected with the Communist cell of the Westminster Labour Party in 1937 was similar in appearance to the woman in the photograph. D'ANTAL said that he recalled his "ginger haired woman" as having curly, frizzy hair, whereas Jennifer Fisher WILLIAMS' hair would appear to be of the straight variety. He also said it would be very difficult to equate any similarity as the photograph of Jennifer Fisher WILLIAMS is of a much older woman. In the course of further conversation, D'ANTAL told me that he had recently been visiting the NEWMARKs, (PF.49,307), and was told by Gerda NEWMARK that after they had visited the Leipzig Fair, she and her husband had been to East Berlin to see Lizzy PHILBY. Lizzy apparently was in somewhat poor health and she had told the NEWMARKS that she had been sacked from her job in some East German publishing firm as a result of her resigning from the Communist Party over the Russian invasion of Czechoslovakia. Apparently Lizzy PHILBY and many of her East German friends had all resigned from the Communist Party over the Czechoslovak issue and that as a consequence of their action, had all been removed from their jobs. D'ANTAL went on to say that the NEWMARKs had told him that there was considerable disillusion amongst the "old guard Communists and that Lizzy had said that some heavy re-indoctrination was going on within the Communist Party.

9. During further discussions about his own work for the R.I.S., BLUNT recalled that in the early part of the war BURGESS had given him instructions on how to contact the R.I.S. in France. As far as he remembered he was to go at a prearranged time and date to the cafe whose name appeared first in the Michelin guide. He also recalled that during the time from the December of 1940 onwards when Lizzie PHILBY had acted as his contact he had met her on several occasions in Bentinck Street in BURGESS' presence. He commented that perhaps Tess ROTHSCHILD would remember the visits although, on reflection, he thought that Lizzie PHILBY might have called only when she knew that Tess would not be there. He had also occasionally met Lizzie PHILBY at the Courtauld Institute. He went on to say that Lizzie PHILBY had made no secret of the fact that BURGESS and PHILBY were also "in the game" and that she was taking the material which they gave her to Bob STEWART at Party Headquarters. He remembered that she had said that STEWART had been given all their names.


