I them asked REES if he could think if people who in his opinion might have been working with BURGESS in his espionage organisation. I realised that this was the "sixty-four dollar question" and that he might want to think about it carefully before he made any reply.

REES asked me if we had ever considered John CAIRNCROSS. I told REES that he had certainly hit the nail on the head for we were quite sure that CAIRNCROSS had indeed been working for BURCESS. I asked REES why he had mentioned CAIRNCROSS as his first candidate. REES replied that CAIRNCROSS was a person whom BURCESS was constantly talking about before the war. He was a person whom BURCESS over-praised so much that REES thought the praise suspicious. This of course was one of BURCESS's most annoying characteristics. He was constantly seizing upon the name of some fairly intelligent: individual and maintaining to his friends that the person was the most remarkable man he had ever met. In the case of CAIRNCROSS he was no doubt a brilliant man but not nearly so brilliant as BURCESS constantly claimed.

Dryden came to see me upon G.C.H.Q. business two days ago. I told him then that we were still making enquiries into the activities of people who had been at Cambridge and I wondered whether he had anything to add to the conversations that had taken place between him and Thistlethwaite some time ago. Apart from a few general comments he could not then think of anything which would help.

I saw DRYDEN again today. He said he had remembered something which might be of interest to me and that it might fit in with something else that I knew.

DRYDEN knew John CAIRNCROSS at Cambridge and has met him from time to time over the last 20 years. He remembers that CAIRNCROSS called in at DRYDEN's house in about 1946 or 1947 and that they did not then meet for a year or two until in about the spring of 1949 CAIRNCROSS telephoned to DRYDEN at G.C.H.Q. CAIRNCROSS said that he had been trying to get hold of DRYDEN and invite him to lunch at the Travellers Club. Shortly after the meal began and, DRYDEN thinks, in the middle of the soup gourse, CAIRNCROSS said rather pointedly "Are we having any success on Russian cyphers now". DRYDEN mumbled some sort of non-committal reply, bringing in the phrase "one-time pad" and tried to give the impression that one could not do anything to make progress. CAIRNCROSS made one more attempt to find out something and then dropped the subject.

I told DRYDEN that this was very interesting and might well fit in with other items of information bearing upon the case of BURGESS and MACLEAN.
