

NOTE FOR FILE

The J.I.C. code-name HOCKENDEN was allotted in May 1962 to the D.1 investigation to identify two R.I.S. agents in the U.K. run by KARPEKOV (P.F. 769,560 Supp. C). [redacted] alleged that these important agents were probably scientists, engineers or business men.

These agents have been identified by D.1 as probably identical with

1. Jack RANGLES - P.F. 606,419 - J.I.C. code-name: - PERSIL
2. Giuseppe MARTELLI - P.F. 790,570.

Since December 1962, HOCKENDEN has been used in error by the Atomic Energy Authority as MARTELLI's code-name. Mr. Bloomfield has suggested that as the D.1 operation on P.F. 769,560 Supp. C is now probably completed, HOCKENDEN should be used as MARTELLI's code-name, since the UKAEA use it.

I shall be grateful if you will let me know whether any of the above subjects are classified.

Giuseppe Enrico Gilberto MARTELLI

The above-named, his wife and their three year old daughter live in a four-bedroomed house at 14 Fitzharrises Road, Abingdon. This address is part of an estate given over to employees of the U.K. Atomic Energy Authority who work in the neighbouring establishments of Harwell and Culham. MARTELLI is a physicist at Culham. His wife is also a physicist. She used to be employed at Birmingham University before the MARTELLIS moved to Abingdon. While she still continues some of her work in association with Birmingham University, it is likely that she will try to get employment at Culham or Harwell.

Also living at No. 14 Fitzharrises Road is a young girl, Hilary MILWARD, (aged 22 to 24) whose sole function is to look after the MARTELLIS' daughter. She does no housework - this appears to be done entirely by a woman by the name of Mrs. FENTON.

Hilary, who is engaged to a Persian, Martin SHIRAZI, a student at Birmingham University, has told the MARTELLIS that she wishes to leave at the end of April. She intends to go back to Birmingham (her home) and get a job at the University.

We discussed these developments on the telephone this morning and you told me that, as a result of my initial enquiry, you had found a possible candidate as a replacement for Hilary. You have also, I believe, conducted a reconnaissance of local advertising media in Abingdon.

As soon as I have any information on the MARTELLIS' plans for replacing Hilary, and particularly how they plan to advertise, I shall, of course, let you know.

I have no idea of the salary that the MARTELLIS pay to Hilary and I know of no other qualifications required for a replacement other than a liking for and the ability to get on with children, the willingness to stay in a great deal in order to look after the child and, of course, a pleasant disposition. It would please MARTELLI if the applicant were attractive, but she must not be too attractive for MARTELLI's wife is jealous.

I should like to discuss this with you again in a few days' time. I hope by then to have some more information for you.

P.S. I have now discovered that Hilary is probably living with the MARTELLIS on what is described as a "semi au pair" basis. This presumably means that she is paid a certain amount which does not amount to a wage. Mrs. MARTELLI confided in a friend that she pays money to Hilary but (presumably for tax purposes) apparently insists that this is pocket money and does not intend to declare it. This seems to indicate that the MARTELLIS would not be able to appeal to someone who is looking for a remunerative job.

HILARY mentioned that the MARTELLI's had gone off to Birmingham. MARTIN reported having got on to the wrong train on Saturday. After some further personal chatter HILARY said - and, after MARTIN had remarked that he was very much worried about her -

H. 'I know darling - listen, I spoke to MARTELLI's last night and straightened everything out, and told them that I felt the best thing that I could do would be, under the circumstances, to finish at the end of April here and to get a job at the University back in Birmingham until we find out what we're doing.

MARTIN told her how much he loved her. HILARY went on-

H. 'I can't stand this being away from you, MARTIN, it's driving me crazy. So, I've fixed it that at the end of APRIL I shall be back home, and, I'll get a job at the university, and, I'll pay my parents board and lodging, you see, and then I shall be free to do what I want with regard-

' But, now I feel much happier because I know in three months time I shall be back again and I shall be with you.

' Anyway, I was going to say to you it doesn't make any difference - I told you I can't wait another year, but, if we have to, then, of course, I will. As long as I'm not 30 or 40 miles away from you I don't mind.

She went on to say that she had now stuck it since November and it was getting her down.

2. MARTELLI resigned his position at Birmingham University in April 1962 and took up a position with Suroton in Brussels. While remaining an employee of Suroton, he began in November 1962 a two year attachment to Culham, an open site of the U.K.A.S.A., whose work is unclassified and where scientists of any nationality may work. Pamela ROTHWELL, to whom MARTELLI now appears to be married, remained on at Birmingham University until November last year. She still appears to be continuing some of her work for Birmingham, but it is not known on what basis. The MARTELLIS and their child are now living at Abingdon.

3. Since we last wrote to you, we have received the following security information on MARTELLI. A report of 1952 alleges that MARTELLI held Communist beliefs at that time. In 1955 it was reported that he and his wife were currently members of the Italian Communist Party and active propagandists. The same report alleged that he had supported an appeal of the 'National Committee of Partisans for Peace.' (A Communist 'front' organisation).

4. We are now conducting an investigation of MARTELLI since we believe that he is one of the two ideological agents of KARPEKOV

Our belief is based on reports from a delicate source which indicate that KARPEKOV had an intelligence contact in England with a scientist of Italian origin, who closely matches MARTELLI's description. As yet we lack positive evidence that MARTELLI is the man in question. We do, however, know that:-

- a) He appears to live beyond his means. His financial affairs appear disordered and he is frequently in the red. Nevertheless, when it comes to the pinch, he always seems able to find money to straighten things out and his wife seems not always to understand quite how he does it. He is said to have private means of some £700 a year from property in Italy. We have not verified this, but it does not seem that this is necessarily the source of his recurrent financial salvation.

- b) KARPEKOV spent seven years in Italy before coming to the U.K. and would have had an opportunity of cultivating MARTELLI, who worked in Rome during part of that time. What is particularly interesting is that from the 26th April to the 2nd May 1962, KARPEKOV visited Brussels and that MARTELLI was in Brussels from the 27th April to the 4th May.
- c) MARTELLI also visited Brussels from the 7th to 12th December 1962 in circumstances which suggest that he placed particular importance on being there at that time. (The 7th was the last day, you may remember, of the heavy fogs.) MARTELLI told his wife that he had to see his boss in Buraton to discuss the work he proposed to do at Culham - he did in fact do so - but neither his wife, nor to us did this alone appear a convincing reason for insisting that he had to visit Brussels at that particular moment. Incidentally, MARTELLI's current financial difficulties were eased as a result of this visit to Brussels. He told his wife that he had collected some salary and it may be that this was in fact the source of the alleviation.

5. A possible explanation of the April episode referred to in paragraph 4(b) above is that KARPEKOV went to Brussels to hand MARTELLI over to a new controller there. By this time MARTELLI was based in Brussels although he was still paying frequent visits to England where his wife and family remained.

6. A possible explanation of the December episode referred to in paragraph 4(c) above is that MARTELLI is still being controlled from Brussels. If so, his controller is likely to be an R.I.S. officer based in Brussels, but if by any chance KARPEKOV himself did visit Belgium between December 7th and 12th, this would of course be highly significant.

7. MARTELLI has no official access to classified information in his present work. It is highly likely however that he is in a position to collect information that would be of value to the Russians. He works under Dr. Kenneth ALLEN, who spends half his time at Culham and the other half on highly classified work at the Atomic Weapons Research Establishment at Aldermaston, and he and his wife, who is herself a competent physicist, together have a wide circle of acquaintances in the field of atomic scientists, some of whom are engaged upon classified work.

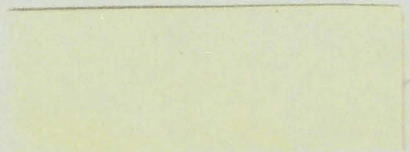

8. I should be grateful for an opportunity to discuss with you the future development of this case. If our hypothesis is correct, MARTELLI may be expected to visit Brussels again in the future for a meeting with his controller. If he does so, it might well be desirable to mount a surveillance operation with your co-operation, similar to that carried out recently in Milan.*

They could work together on Sunday doing the report together. PALUMBO would ring him again, but, should he not ring, it would mean that he could not get away.

When visiting Roger Lees at A.E.A. on the 3rd January, I asked him if he could arrange for us to be notified as soon as possible of the PETRAVICS' address in the Culham area. He will arrange for Irwin to lay this on with Kenneth Bloomfield on the former's return to duty on Monday, 7th January.

Lees also showed me a copy of a report from Brig. Bell, a copy of which we shall receive, giving details of Bell's researches into the alarm at Culham and Aldermaston over the disclosure of KUC's Communist record. It appears that ADAMS delegated the job of informing all concerned of KUC to Dennis Willson, the Secretary at Culham, who is regarded in fact as indiscreet by the A.E.A. Security Branch. ADAMS and WILLSON are close friends in addition to being colleagues.

A point which emerged from Bell's report (if we did not know this before) was that the PETRAVICS were recommended to Culham by MARTELLI and also by Dr. Brian FLOWERS (PF.713,062) of Manchester University, who is an A.E.A. Consultant on unclassified matters and a former Senior member of the Harwell staff.

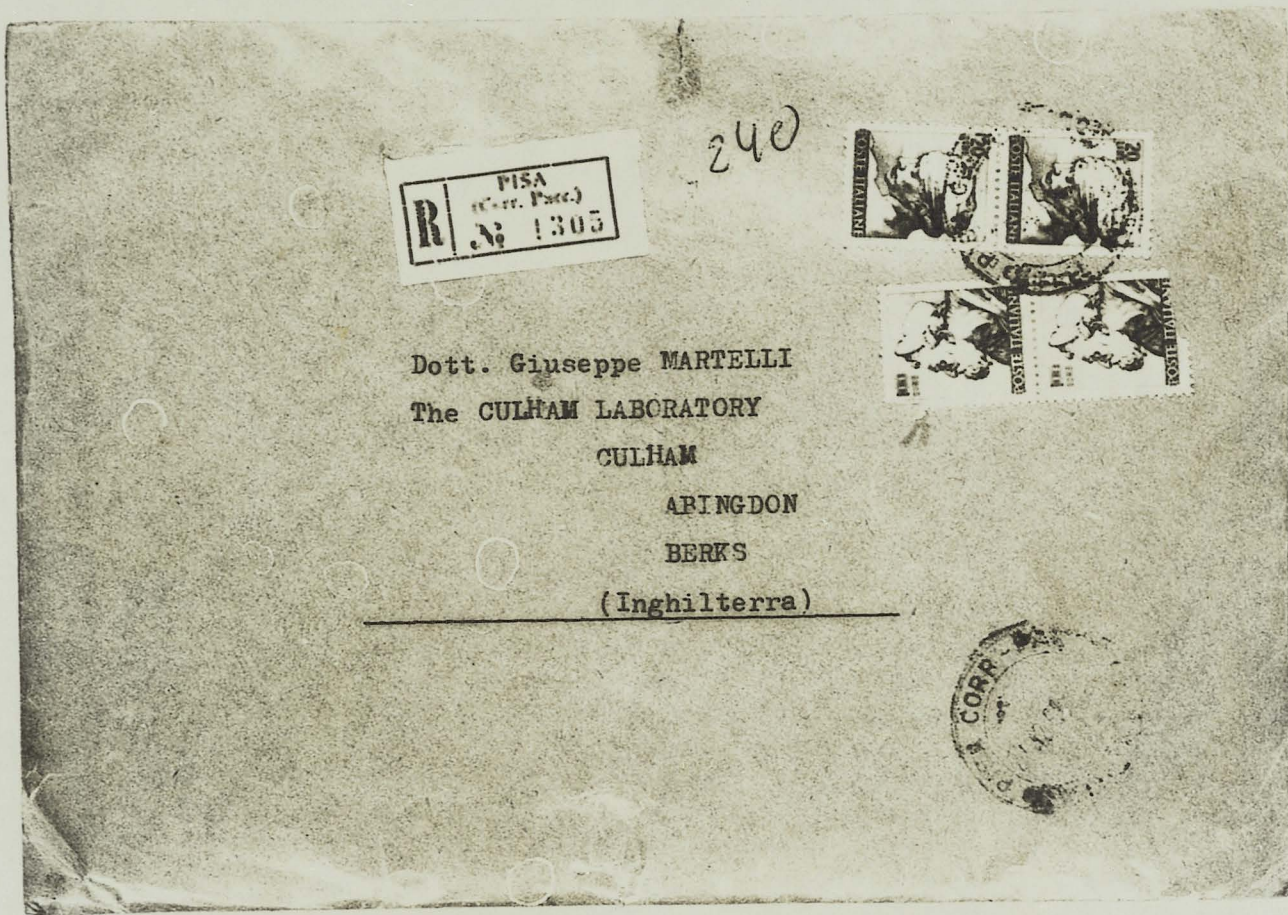

MARTELLI was to give DISTANT another ring to-morrow, when he hoped to have more information.
 MARTELLI said they were spending CHRISTMAS at home, but going to WESTBHAM on the 26th, until the 30th. MARTELLI might have to come back for the 27th - 28th because of something that had been happening in the laboratories.

Martelli himself does not appear to be interested!

MARTELLI

"I cannot work in ALDERMASTON, you see. After all, they declassified the place, but not for foreigners. That I mean, I sound as though it was a tragedy, but it pleases me enormously, because that means that I instead get my own laboratory and my own group here in CALNE?" *Culham*

It was on this account that MARTELLI might have to return on the 27th - 28th, leaving PAMELA and SUZANNA at WESTBHAM, and then returning to fetch them. On the 31st, there was also to be a meeting to discuss this business. The call ended with MARTELLI repeating that he would get in touch with DISTANT again to-morrow. 23.09.

concerning Gioletta Kuo

I discussed my letter dated 13.12.62. with Geoffrey Patterson in his office the day after he received it. He told me that he felt he ought to pass on our information to the Chairman of the Atomic Energy Authority, Sir Roger Makins, and asked if we would have any objection to his doing so. I said that he might give Makins the information contained in our letter but if there was any question of Makins wishing to say something to the Deputy Chairman and the Research Member, Sir William Penney, and others, only the information relating to Miss KUO's Communist activities connected with the C.U.C.S. should be used.

Patterson came to see me today and told me that he had seen Makins and had shown him our letter. Makins had asked Patterson to see Sir William Penney himself and this was done on Friday last. Penney was extremely concerned to be told of Miss KUO's Communist past, and because she was Chinese and because the Chinese were actively engaged at the moment in trying to find out all they could in the atomic field, he felt that, while it might be difficult to ~~obtain~~ any objection to KUO and her husband working at Culham, he was quite sure they should be excluded from Aldermaston, even as visitors, and from Harwell too. He realised that this might prove difficult and had therefore been to see Dr. Adams, the Director of Culham, on Monday of this week. He told Adams that he had reason to believe that KUO had a Communist record and added that since she was Chinese, one must assume that she might be on the look-out for what information she could acquire.

maintain

This morning Patterson had received a telephone call from John Henry, the Security Officer at Aldermaston. Henry said that Dr. Allen, who was employed half the time on Culham work and under whom MARTELLI works, had come to him in considerable alarm to say that he had heard from Adams that Gioletta KUO was a Communist and a spy.

Patterson confirmed that he had told Penney of no part of Gioletta KUO's record apart from that concerning her Communist activities. I asked him if he would see Sir William Penney again to make sure that he had not said anymore than is indicated above. This he has done. Penney confirmed Patterson's statement of what he (Penney) had told Adams and was horrified to hear of what had happened. He said that he had told Adams that he should be on his guard and stressed that what he had told him was in strict confidence, except that he might pass on a warning, using if necessary the information Patterson had given him, to the four Divisional Heads at A.W.R.E. who have anything to do with weapons. Allen is one of the four Divisional Heads.

It has now been arranged that Brig. Bell, the Group Security Officer at Harwell, will call on Adams and will take the opportunity of referring to Gioletta KUO. He will tell him that he understands that the story is going around that KUO is a spy and will tell him that there is no basis for this belief and will remind Adams of the danger that could be run by himself or any other individual who puts about the story and thus renders himself liable to action for defamation of character. John Henry will also see Dr. Allen and will take the same line with him. Both will seek to establish what Adams and Allen have said to anyone else.

Patterson undertook to keep me informed of developments and I promised to let him know if I had any indication that the story had come to MARTELLI's ears.

Suggested oral answers to the questions X and Y at serials 95b and 96b:

X: On grounds of source security we could not tell Euratom that MARTELLI is a suspect^{ed} spy. Anything less than this, such as alleged Communist sympathies, would not wash. Culham is an open site and even Iron Curtain nationals are admitted there. The solution we prefer is to continue investigating MARTELLI until we can catch him redhanded in some act of espionage. We can then put up a case to the Home Office for his exclusion from the U.K. as an undesirable alien. Since he is not supposed to have access to classified information we do not envisage a prosecution.

Y: We have some evidence of R.I.S. interest in Imperial College apart from the MARTELLI case. It has not been considered necessary to inform D.S.I.R. or any other Government Department of this, since there are no classified contracts at Imperial College. Any staff members of Imperial College who may be employed as consultants by Government Departments in connection with classified work will receive individual security clearance and security education in accordance with normal practice.

As you know, HOCKENDEN is seeing a lot of Dr. K. W. Allen who is at present on the staff of A.W.R.E. Allen has access to highly sensitive material including TOP SECRET United States defence information.

Allen will be transferred, I understand in the fairly near future, to Culham although he will retain an office in Aldermaston and spend a certain amount of time there. Even when Allen goes on to the Culham strength, the Director of A.W.R.E., Dr. Levin, wishes to retain Allen's services on a Committee which discusses TOP SECRET matters and studies certain G.C.H.Q. material. Because Allen is so highly regarded, I suspect that Aldermaston will continue to use and consult Allen on other matters outside the normal C.T.R. work of Culham.

In the normal course of events I would advise my Member, Sir Alan Hitchman, to rule that Culham personnel must sever all contact with A.W.R.E. except on an unclassified basis. Allen would be one of several people to be affected. But I thought I should consult you in case the action we propose could alert HOCKENDEN. There should be little risk because if Allen is obeying the rules he does not disclose to unclassified staff any information relating to his classified activities. Therefore from HOCKENDEN's point of view there should appear to be no change. On the other hand, Allen may inadvertently disclose that "Security" are the cause of keeping him away from certain matters with which he had expected to keep in touch.

The Authority would obviously prefer that HOCKENDEN should not have official day to day dealings with anyone whose head is full of secrets. With a few exceptions, of whom Allen will be one, the people at Culham have no access. I would like to arrange that there be no exceptions at all but it may be difficult in Allen's case as he has particular ability and know-how and A.W.R.E. will be most reluctant to lose his services. However, I feel we ought to try, as long as such action by us will not prejudice your investigation.

May I please have your views?

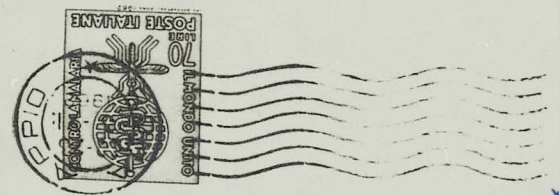

Although we had been informed that MARTELLI was travelling from Birmingham to London, leaving at 0840, it later transpired that his journey was from Didcot and we were unable to make contact with him at the London terminus.

2. Observation was switched to the West London Air Terminal, Cromwell Road, and at 1245 MARTELLI entered the lounge and checked in at the desk. He was told that flight 470 to Brussels was delayed.

3. We took the opportunity of arranging for other officers, who were engaged on cases nearby, to make their way to the air terminal for the purpose of taking a look at MARTELLI and we now have about a dozen officers who know this man.

4. At 1400 MARTELLI's flight was called and he boarded a coach for the airport.


It has emerged from the telephone check material on MARTELLI that he is intending to leave the U.K. today (Friday, 7 December) to spend the weekend in Brussels. He has booked a ticket on B.E.A. Flight 470 which leaves London Airport (Heath Row) at 1.55 - weather permitting. He is due at the Air Terminal at 12.45. His wife telephoned the Railway Station at Didcot this morning to enquire if the 8.50 train to London was running to schedule. It is likely that she was making this enquiry on MARTELLI's behalf.

MARTELLI's purpose in going to Brussels appears to be two-fold.

- 1) To fetch some money. (He may obtain this either from his Bank in Brussels or from the Headquarters of Euratom there since he is still an employee of Euratom.) - or the RIS
- 2) To discuss his work and his future plans for work at Culham with a scientist called PALUMBO, who was his superior when he worked directly for Euratom. PALUMBO has offered to put him up for the weekend and MARTELLI seems to be inclined to accept the invitation.

There is a possibility that MARTELLI's visit to Brussels is designed to provide him with an opportunity to meet his R.I.S. controller and the rather vague reference to "fetch money" may indicate that he is due to collect a payment from his controller. It is thought ^{un} however that it is likely that his visit has any nefarious purpose, largely because he appears to be in considerable doubt as to whether he really *wants to go or not.

The only action that has been taken therefore in connection with MARTELLI's trip is to use it as a long awaited opportunity to enable A.4 to obtain a sight of MARTELLI and possibly photographs. (The only photograph which A.4 hold is a fairly old one.) This could be achieved by spotting MARTELLI at the Air Terminal and/or at London Airport. A.4. have therefore been asked to meet the 8.50 train from Didcot and to mount observation at the London Air Terminal. If they are successful in seeing MARTELLI and obtaining photographs there, there will be no need for them to continue to London Airport.

...

1. When we saw the D.G. on the morning of 4th December I mentioned that Sir Roger Makins thought he ought to tell his Minister, the Lord President, something about the current cases in the Authority. The D.G. indicated the lines on which he thought the Chairman might like to speak to Lord Hailsham and I undertook to pass this on. I was not aware that the Chairman and the Lord President were in fact meeting at the very time we were discussing the matter in the D.G.'s office. I was thus unable to communicate the D.G.'s views to the Chairman.

2. The Chairman told me this morning what had transpired at his meeting with the Lord President. He opened by saying he had come to tell the Lord President, on a strictly personal basis, that the Security Service had information which suggested the Authority were penetrated by the R.I.S. Lord Hailsham replied that "a little bird" had already mentioned this matter to him and he had been about to ask the Chairman what it was all about (the Chairman and I assume that the little bird was probably the P.M.).

3. The Chairman evidently said he had always thought that A.W.R.E. would be the top target for the R.I.S. and that Aldermaston was the obvious place to look for a spy. The Chairman went on to say that he understood that two possible candidates - both in more or less innocuous places - had been identified and he thought that one of them was connected with Euratom. When he heard this, Lord Hailsham asked why we did not go to Euratom H.Q. and arrange for the suspect to be withdrawn? The Chairman guesses what your answer to this may be - that because of the source one cannot possibly entrust such information to anyone in Euratom - but because the question came from his Minister he felt obliged to put it to you through me.

4. As I understand it, the Lord President indicated that it would be preferable to get rid of "low level" spies, through administrative or other means, rather than inflict another spy case on the public. In relation to this remark, the Chairman mentioned this morning that we might be wise to encourage PERSIL to take a job in Europe with Euratom, thus getting him off our books.

5. The Lord President and Chairman continued to talk about spies in scientific circles and the Chairman mentioned the Imperial College as a possible target. The Lord President then asked if D.S.I.R. were aware of this? The Chairman said he did not know, but would enquire.

7. I must emphasise that this was a private discussion between the Chairman and the Lord President. The Chairman said he was putting nothing on paper (suggesting that the Lord President should act similarly).



Living with the MARTELLIS, as the telephone check shows, is a young girl, Hilary MILWARD, who appears to be living "au pair" and her duties include looking after the MARTELLIS's young daughter. She has a boy friend by the name of Martin SHIRAZI, whom she hopes to marry. There is no indication of when the marriage is likely to be, but it might take place at any time in the near future. It is likely therefore that the MARTELLIS may soon be looking for a replacement for her. The telephone check has also shown recently that the relationship between Hilary and the MARTELLIS, hitherto cordial, has become somewhat difficult, and there is therefore the additional possibility that, quite apart from her marriage, there may be other reasons why she might leave the MARTELLIS's service.

I spoke to Mr. Beith of D.4. this morning of the possibility of finding a replacement for Hilary who could be of assistance to us. This would not be an easy task at present since Beith has no contacts in the Abingdon/Oxford area. He is however considering what he might be able to do and he is carrying out a preliminary survey of employment agencies and advertising media in the Abingdon area. I have undertaken to let him know as soon as possible when I get any indication of Hilary's intention to leave.the MARTELLIS.



I have spoken to Harlow and Hawkins of the G.P.O. concerning the extension of the letter and telephone check to MARTELLI's professional address. Harlow confirmed that there would be no difficulty in extending the check to Culham. He confirmed that the mail would be sent down to him from Abingdon for opening and copying. He told me that the MARTELLIS had sent in a redirection notice to the Postmaster at Birmingham. I reminded Harlow that the restriction on the mail to be opened, to that originating from overseas, was to be retained.

Harlow told me that the G.P.O. has no adverse record of any of its employees on the mail side in Abingdon. Those members of the office who would be made aware of the fact that MARTELLI's mail is being intercepted are the Head Postmaster, the Assistant Postmaster and possibly the latter's deputy, together with the Assistant Inspector and the Duty Inspector, who acts as the latter's stand-in, both of whom will be employed in removing mail for the street in which MARTELLI lives and the whole of the Culham Laboratory for scrutiny for letters destined for MARTELLI. Over a period of time it was of course unavoidable that the postmen on these particular walks would have the opportunity of discovering that MARTELLI's mail was of interest.

Harlow told me that among the telephone staff of the Abingdon exchange there was an individual, one C.W.G. GRANT, for whom a security record existed. (He is the holder of PF.123,971)

Hawkins is investigating the feasibility of the extension of the telephone check to MARTELLI's number at the Culham Laboratory. I have told him of the existence of GRANT.

GRANT's security record consists solely of the fact that a registration form for the B.C.P. was filled up in his name in 1949. He was described in the registration form as a Telephone Engineer at Oxford and living at Woodside, Frilford, near Abingdon, and his Party Branch was given as North Berkshire.

Comparison of the handwriting on the registration form and that of GRANT himself indicates that GRANT did not himself fill in the registration form. Enquiries have failed to show that he has any Communist sympathies and it may be that he was not consulted about the completion of the registration form. The theory has been advanced that it might have been a hoax since GRANT is said to be a target for the leg-puller.

Ken reported that Hockenden's wife had sought a laboratory job at Culham but had been turned down. Ken does not know the reason why she was not accepted but gathers that she is not unduly worried because she is pretty busy at the moment with domestic affairs and they are still on the look-out for a private house. Apparently their first choice of a private house was unsuitable because the damp course was unsatisfactory.

Ken reported that Hockenden has now been to Aldermaston three times.

Hockenden asked for laboratory facilities at Culham but was told that he is to work on the Phoenix project, which will be based on Aldermaston until about June next year when it will move to Culham.

Although considerable attention was paid to Hockenden by J.B.Adams and D.R.Willson (inparticular) when he first arrived, Ken has noticed that this is not so pronounced now. Ken has the feeling that Hockenden is not getting things quite so much his own way as he did in the first instance and does not seem to be seeing as much of D.R.Willson as he did.

Ken has heard that Hockenden has been told to write to Euratom H.Q. in London for C.D. plates for his car. Ken believes that the boss there is also an Italian. He has been to Culham where he had a full day's discussion with D.R.Willson. Ken will supply his name in a few days time. He has a Citroen car with C.D. plates and the special Euratom (EUR) number plate with five red stars - similar to the one on Hockenden's car.

Ken reported that he will almost certainly get to know of Hockenden's movements in and out of Culham, without having to "stick his neck out" unduly, but he may not necessarily hear about these movements in advance.

John Henry telephoned at 12.55 p.m. today to say that Dr. Ken ALLEN had just asked him if it would be in order for him to receive GUISEPPE MARTELLI again in Aldermaston (John Henry referred to him as MARTINELLI, but I think the two must be identical). Henry went on to say that MARTELLI would be seeing Dr. Sweetman but that he was rather worried that these visits by uncleared aliens to Aldermaston should take place at all. Henry said that if any of them turned out to be a spy the repercussions could be extremely embarrassing. What, he asked, could one do about preventing a man such as MARTELLI coming in a second time if he had already been in once? He thought this could blow a source.

I said I did not care for the idea ^{of} that any of these aliens - Greeks, French, Italians, etc. - coming into A.W.R.E. until it was properly segregated. I thought that Henry could ask Ken ALLEN if this Italian's visit was really necessary. If he said it was, it might be difficult to refuse him entry as the visit is to take place today. I suggested that Henry should endeavour to discourage ALLEN from doing this kind of thing, that he should be warned not to discuss anything of a classified nature and that proper arrangements should be made for escorting, etc. I also suggested that John Henry should see Sweetman and, indeed, anyone else with whom MARTELLI or any of the other aliens might come into contact and tell them to keep to absolutely unclassified subjects.

It seemed to me that John Henry had heard from somewhere or other that MARTELLI is of interest to me and he was on a fishing expedition. I did my best not to confirm his suspicions.

8.0 a.m. Mr. Irwin left home by car and picked up Mr. Douglas Bloomfield at Reading Railway Station (10.45 a.m.). They both went to Harwell where they saw Brigadier Bell, Group Security Officer. He explained the security problems of Harwell and after lunch took Mr. Bloomfield and Mr. Irwin round parts of the site, including visits to reactors and to segregated areas where classified documents are maintained. The system of safeguarding such information was explained. The tour also included a visit to N.I.R.N.S. and to the Harwell library where the arrangements for safeguarding classified documents there was demonstrated.

Mr. Bloomfield and Mr. Irwin left Harwell at 6.0 p.m. They then drove to Abingdon and had a quick look at Fitzharrys Road. It was noted that No.14 was occupied, though the occupants were out. Furniture has been installed though curtains were not yet up. They then drove past Culham in the dark en route to Mr. Douglas Bloomfield's home in Gerrards Cross which they reached about 8.0 p.m.

On his return home at about 10.0 p.m. Mr. Irwin found a letter dated 7th November from Ken awaiting him. It contained a copy of A.E.R.E. news, dated 1st November 1962 and a list of attached staff to Culham, showing the position as at 31.10.62. The text of the letter from Ken was as follows:-

"Just a short note with the A.E.R.E. news, etc. I'm afraid A.E.R.E. news is pretty dull reading most of the time. You did say you would like to see it though? The other I see is issued monthly.

I was pleased to see that the lad had settled in well, didn't see much of him though because he has been at Aldermaston all day - just as well because I was busy too on my first day back, an absolute mountain of paper work.

Saw a lovely car today, a fawn Mercedes 220 or 300. I had a feeling that it belonged to someone I had met, but the number plate foxed me - EUR 1957 - anyway it was dark and the driver was not around, so perhaps I am all mixed up. Maybe I'll see it again some time. I could use one like that myself."



The context in which these names were mentioned by MARTELLI has now been established by Peter Irwin in consultation with Ken Bloomfield and is as follows:-

At the time in question, MARTELLI was using an office close to Ken's and they both used the same tea room at the morning and afternoon breaks. During one of the tea-breaks, MARTELLI, for whom Ken had already performed a number of small services, wandered up to him and said something on the following lines:-

"There are certain people in the Authority whom I used to know (or knew of - Ken is not quite sure which): I wonder where they are now." Ken had obligingly looked up the names of the people mentioned by MARTELLI in an Authority telephone book. Of the five mentioned, only DUNGEY was not already at Culham.

Mr. Irwin visited Aldermaston on the orders of Mr. Lees to carry out a survey of the areas which will be fenced out there in order to provide a site where unclassified work can be carried out by Culham, N.I.R.N.S. and staff attached to there who have not been cleared.

Mr. Irwin discussed the proposed arrangements with Mr. J.W.HOUNSHAM, one of the Divisional Administrative Officers of the areas concerned. In answer to a question regarding the date on which the scheme should come into operation, Mr. HOUNSHAM replied that the arrangements were being pushed forward with great speed by Dr. K. W. ALLEN. This appeared to be all on behalf of one particular foreigner named HOCKENDEN (proper name given) who ALLEN was most anxious to get working at Aldermaston as soon as possible. Mr. HOUNSHAM said that Dr. ALLEN had brought HOCKENDEN to Aldermaston on 7th November. HOUNSHAM considered that although Dr. ALLEN did not take kindly to security, he would observe the rules controlling the unclassified area when they were introduced. However, Dr. ALLEN himself would of course continue to visit the main area of Aldermaston fairly frequently.

12.15 p.m.: Ken telephoned Mr. Irwin and reported that a letter was in the post to him, including details of another car believed to be owned by HOCKENDEN.

HOCKENDEN has joined the sametea club as Ken at Culham, which means that although Ken has made no conscious effort to do so, he sees HOCKENDEN fairly frequently.

Mr. Irwin received letter from Ken, postmarked 14.11.62, as follows:-

Others of interest, Dr. W. B. Thompson, was his wife still working? Apparently a physicist. Dr. K.V.ROBERTS, Dr. J.B.TAYLOR, BICKERTON.

You might like to know Miss Amamaine ZANELLA and Sig. Vittoria PELLISARI, both of Brussels.

Asked me how he could make phone call to Brussels and pay for it - made three calls, about his pay he said, he volunteered this information when I was explaining to him the method of paying for the calls.

Tell namesake not to worry. I am not pressing things even though it might appear so.

Hope you had nice weather and a pleasant time in the South, no sun-tan this time though!

Sorry we were not able to meet even though there was nothing exciting for you where I was.

When I was at Aldermaston on Friday, November 9th, I learned quite by chance that an Italian had recently visited the site. During my visit I was able to call on Superintendent Powell and while there I asked him to show me his arrangements for recording the names of visitors, in particular aliens. While looking through his records, I came across the following:

November 7th "Guiseppe Martelli, ^{SLW PWS B11} his mother's house via Sistina 138, Roma."

his sponsor was given as ^{SLW} Dr. Ken Allen. ^{typo}

In another book held by the police, Martelli's address was given as 14 Fitzharrys Avenue, Abingdon.

Without making further enquiries - which in the circumstances would be undesirable - one cannot find out where Martelli went or what he was up to on the site.

I also learned during my visit that Dr. Allen is still on the strength of A.W.R.E. He recently committed a serious breach of security in copying a SECRET ATOMIC * PRINCIPAL document, which shows a degree of irresponsibility.

Incoming call from MARTELLI to PAM, saying that he had rung Birmingham. Miss LAWYER (ph) was not there. He had left a message asking if she would ring up before 12 o'clock. Her extension was 180. He intended giving her their home telephone number. MARTELLI mentioned having no headed paper of Birmingham University. He would come home very early because of this. MARTELLI had inquired about having the Dauphine serviced. This could not be done before 10 day's time. He would therefore send in the Mercedes for servicing. He had been told of a Rainault agent at Kingston (??Baghills). PAM explained that this was about 10 miles away from here. The garage, said MARTELLI, was called SOUTHWORE (ph). He thought he might take her there this afternoon. PAM would look it up in the book. PAM apologized for being cross and bad tempered. She spoke of having so much to do and went on to remark about the necessity of 'publishing now' in order to show that what was published before was not dead right. MARTELLI mentioned ADAMS having said that he wanted to see him early this afternoon. He did not himself know when he would be back there. Should he be back and ADAMS were free then he would go and see him, otherwise - 'pazienza' - he would see him on Monday. PAM remarked - P. Yes, I think - yes, I should start being a bit independent with these - is he not in this morning? MARTELLI said that he was in but was very busy. ~~MARTELLI~~ MARTELLI went on - N. I am very interested in seeing him in fact - about fixing to get a laboratory for myself, you see -

Miss ZANELLA

MARTELLI was now going to write to Mr. STANELLA (ph) - 'Otherwise I don't get the salary this month'. He confirmed that he would be able to go into Oxford this afternoon. He agreed to ring the Electricity Board, Mr. ALEXANDER, about putting in the plug. PAM pointed out that they required a 15 am plug in the kitchen without which they were not able to use the washing machine.

1. Type plan of four bedroomed house similar to 14 Fitzharrys Road.
2. Sketch plan showing road lay-out of Abingdon Estate including Fitzharrys Road.

4. List of residents of all Harwell estates, including the Abingdon estate.

In the letter reference was made to a telephone message from Ken on 31.x.62 reporting that he had noticed scribbled up on the blackboard of the office to be occupied by HOCKENDEN the word "TRINOLER".

Copies made of documents 1, 2, 3 and 4 referred to above and sent to Mr. Douglas Bloomfield.

Copy of document No. 3, which is rather large, will be made later and original will be sent to Mr. Douglas Bloomfield.

2.11.62

Letter dated 31st October and postmarked 1st November received from Ken reporting that although the rent of 14 Fitzharrys Road has been paid and the keys have been in possession of HOCKENDEN for a month, there is no furniture in the house, neither is there any evidence of personal belongings. Ken also understands that the house purchase arrangements have fallen through (This presumably refers to the endeavours of HOCKENDEN to obtain a private house in the vicinity).

Ken also reports that the office services in which we might be interested, follow a pattern up the wall and across the ceiling into a box in the corridor.

Ken hopes to be back at work on Monday (5.11.62).

2nd November 1962

Mr. Irwin sent a letter to Ken acknowledging receipt of letters and documents and suggesting he phoned Mr. Irwin on Monday (5.11.62) at noon if convenient.

4.30 p.m. Mr. Irwin spoke to Mr. Douglas Bloomfield by telephone and reported information supplied by Ken. Mr. Bloomfield requested Mr. Irwin to ask Ken to proceed with caution and not to "stick his neck out too far."

5th November 1962

12.15 p.m. Ken telephoned Mr. Irwin and reported that he was now out of hospital but would not be returning to work until Wednesday. He had nothing further to report. Mr. Irwin conveyed Mr. Douglas Bloomfield's caution of 2nd November. 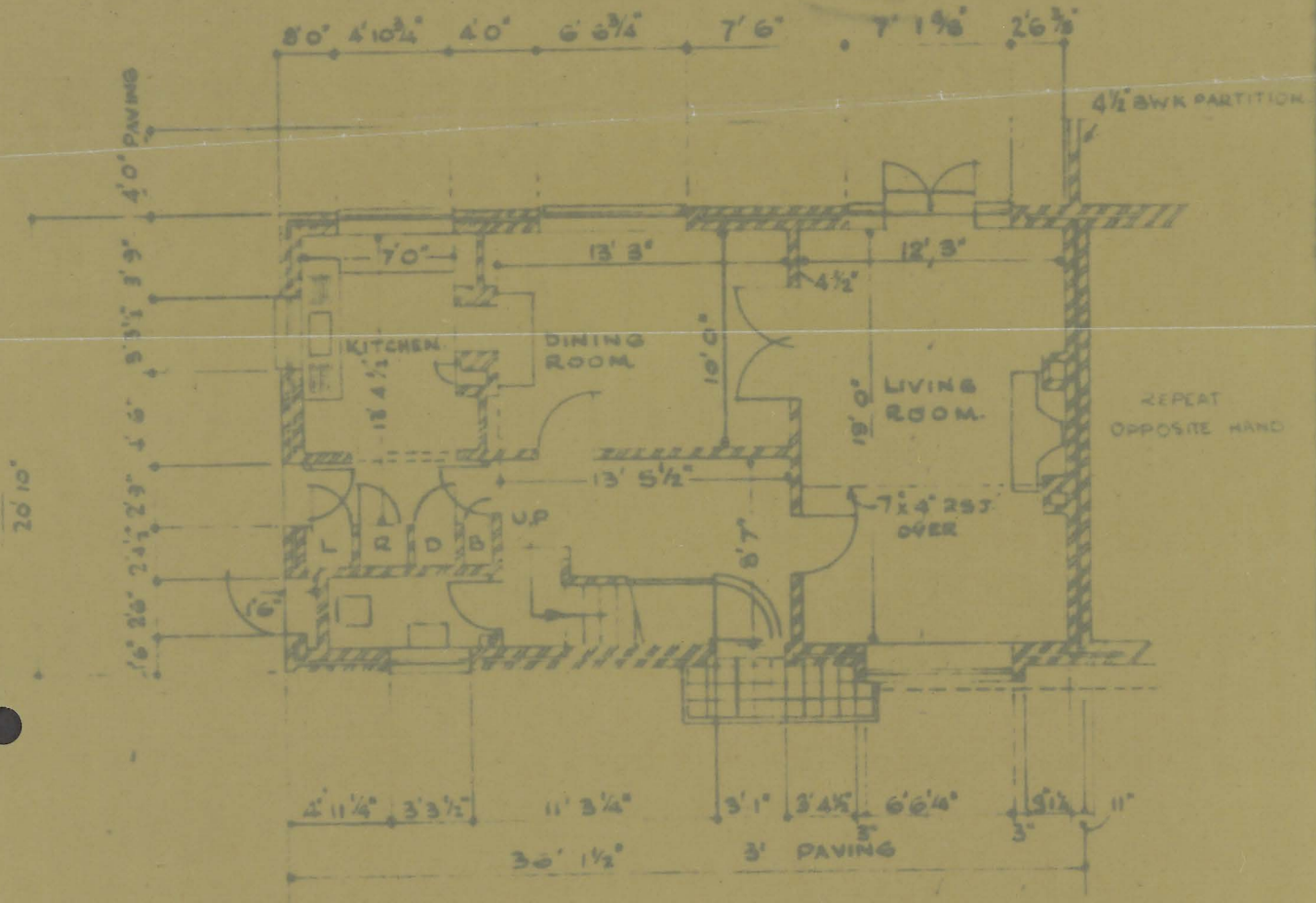

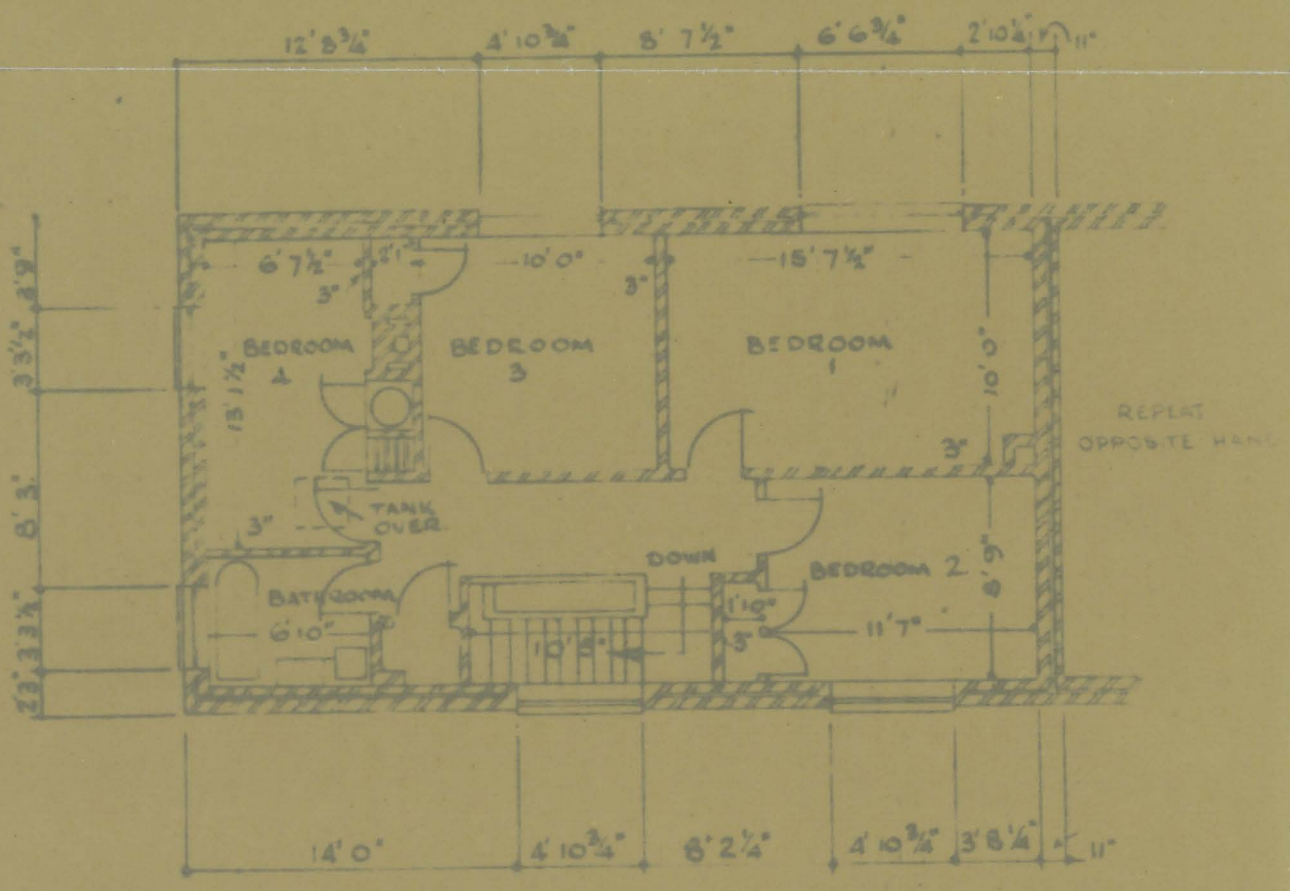
