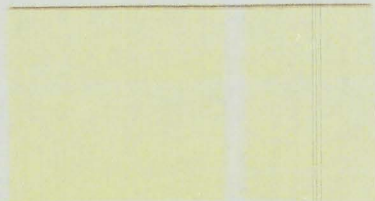

We know that MARTELLI is to cable to his wife at her hotel in Norway details of his plans for returning to Britain from his holiday and business trip to Italy, Greece, Yugoslavia and Belgium. (See 'X' on page 4 of Serial 221a). The cable could at the earliest have been sent from Zagreb on the 15th/16th April, but it is more likely to be sent from Brussels on or after the 21st April when MARTELLI's final plans for staying there are completed.

We now have Mrs. MARTELLI's (Pamela ROTHWELL's) addresses in Norway (see Serial 225a) and I have ascertained from Collins of G.C.H.Q. that there is a chance of CUBIST being successful in obtaining details of the cable.

I am therefore seeking your formal approval for the temporary addition of Mrs. MARTELLI's name to the CUBIST list for the period 18th to 27th April 1963. Your verbal approval was obtained yesterday afternoon. There is a letter H.O.W. on the MARTELLIS at various addresses but not including Mrs. MARTELLI's temporary addresses in Norway.

For convenience, I have inserted Mrs. MARTELLI's file number on the S.439 form.

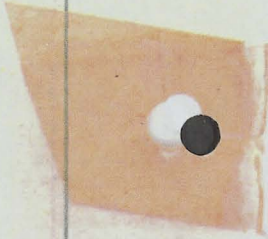
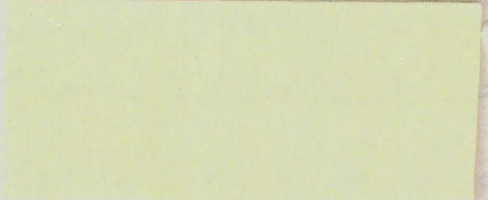

At meetings held during the day involving Director D., D.1., A.1., L.A., Commander Evan Jones of Special Branch and myself, the following tentative arrangements were made:-

- (a) The interrogation of MARTELLI would be conducted by Chief Inspector Stratton of Special Branch on the basis of the existing written brief and a supplementary verbal briefing on the latest developments by D.1/DWB. The Security Service would not take part in the interrogation directly, but the case officer would be on hand during the interrogation for consultations with Stratton. The case officer would not be able to appear before MARTELLI.
- (b) The existing temporary circular would be amended to include the additional requirement that local Special Branch at the ports should be notified of MARTELLI's arrival.
- (c) Chief Inspector Stratton would this evening visit Special Branch at Southend Airport, as the most likely place of arrival for MARTELLI, and brief them on action to be taken. A similar briefing would be done by green line telephone to Special Branch representatives at Lydd, Dover and IAP this evening.
- (d) If prior information on MARTELLI's arrival were available, Stratton, D.1/DWB and a further Special Branch officer and a representative of A.2 would be at the Airport before the plane's arrival. The A.2. officer and the additional Special Branch officer would be there to examine the car. It would be desirable to bring the car up to London, but insurance considerations may make this impossible.
- (e) If no prior indication of MARTELLI's arrival were available, the Special Branch officer at the port would be instructed to have Stratton notified immediately and until his arrival would hold MARTELLI under conditions which would prohibit him from destroying or disposing of any incriminating material which may be in his possession.
- (f) MARTELLI would be searched by Special Branch at the earliest opportunity but he would be brought to Scotland Yard for interrogation.

L.A. gave as his opinion and that of the D.P.P. that MARTELLI could be charged under the Official Secrets Act if he refused to supply adequate explanation for his possession of the material in his drawer at Culham and certain entries in his diary, or, if he made any admission of espionage against his country whether past or present. If he were to admit that he was a spy but said that his espionage was not directed against this country, no charge would be preferable: he could, of course, be deported.

- (g) A search warrant would be executed as soon as possible upon his house and office. The house is situated in Berkshire and the office in Oxfordshire. Warrants would therefore have to be obtained by representatives of these police forces. A.I. would ask Supt. ^{imp?} Lawson of the Berkshire Police and a representative of the Oxfordshire Police to come up tomorrow for briefing. C.C. Berkshire is already to some extent in the picture about MARTELLI but C.C. Oxfordshire knows nothing. It was proposed that the name of a Metropolitan Special Branch officer should be included in each search warrant. It was decided that a warrant would be necessary for the search of MARTELLI's office even though this was Atomic Energy Authority property because this would probably render proceedings simpler in case Adams, the Director of Culham, proved difficult to deal with and Making, the Chairman of A.E.A., was not immediately available. (It was originally intended that the search of MARTELLI's office should be conducted a few hours before his arrival, if this information ~~was~~ available, and immediately he arrived if it was not. However, subsequent consideration indicated that there might be some virtue in delaying the search of the office until the interrogation of MARTELLI had progressed some way. There was no reason why the material in his office should be produced at the beginning of the interrogation.)
- (h) Special Branch requested that in addition to providing a Security Service officer for the search of MARTELLI's car and for the search of his office and his home, an additional officer should be provided to assist in the search of MARTELLI's person.
- (i) It would not be necessary for MARTELLI to be present at either the search of his house or his office. Because he might not arrive before his wife's arrival back from Oslo, it would be necessary to obtain the key to the house from the A.E.A. This could be obtained through the invention of Roger Lees of A.E.A.



- (j) It was pointed out to Commander Evan Jones that it would be of great assistance to Stratton if the case officer could actually listen to the interrogation while not being present. This point will be pursued with Stratton.
- (k) Commander Evan Jones agreed that Mrs. MARTELLI could be questioned in connection with the search of the house.
- (l) D.1/DWB pointed out that MARTELLI has arrangements for collecting certain mail from the Abingdon and Birmingham branches of his bank. This would be available to the police as soon as a charge was made.
- (m) D.1/DWB is to visit Stratton at Special Branch at 10 am. on Tuesday, 23rd April. He will take advantage of this meeting to supplement the existing written brief and to discuss with Stratton the handling of the interrogation. He will then accompany Stratton and Commander Evan Jones to the office of the D.P.F. where with L.A. the detailed proposals of the action to be taken against MARTELLI will be discussed with Sir Theobald Mathew.

With Colonel Winterborn I saw the Director of Public Prosecutions this afternoon on the MARTELLI case. I told the Director that MARTELLI was an Italian working at Culham in Berkshire, which was the responsibility of the Atomic Energy Authority, that MARTELLI had no access to secrets in the course of his work and he was married to a British girl who was not conscious of his espionage activities. I further told the Director that we had made a clandestine search of papers in MARTELLI's desk last night, as a result of which we found concealed in a packet of cigarettes two one-time pads, such as were used by LONSDALE, and in his diary an entry which appeared to be related to the method of photographing documents. There were also one or two other minor matters which could properly be described as spies' tools.

But see 235a | 2. I said that in my opinion on these facts MARTELLI could be arrested and charged with doing an act preparatory to committing an offence against Section 1 of the 1911 Act, contrary to the provisions of Section 7 of the 1920 Act. I told the Director our present plan was that MARTELLI should be arrested when he returned from the Continent, where he presently was travelling, and then questioned, and at the same time a search warrant should be issued by the Berkshire Police formally bringing into evidence the spy material we had found on our clandestine search. I also told the Director that I thought MARTELLI's car should be technically examined.

3. The Director entirely agreed with the views I expressed and said he would be prepared to authorize MARTELLI's arrest on a charge of doing an act preparatory. When he was questioned it might be that he would give an explanation which showed that he had not committed any offence against the Official Secrets Act in that he had not passed to the Russians any British secrets, in which case he could be deported; or in the alternative he might admit spying and passing British secrets over a longish period. The final charges could not be settled, therefore, until he had been questioned.

4. On my return I informed the D.D.G. of the Director's opinion, the D.D.G. then being with Sir Laurence Helsby. I also saw D. and passed to him the Director's opinion. I told D. that in the Director's view MARTELLI should be interviewed by a Security Service officer who had previous Police experience as this would obviate any chance of MARTELLI withdrawing, when seen by a Police Officer, any statement he had made to one of our officers. I also pointed out to D. when the Berkshire Police executed the search warrant they should hand the documents to Hedger direct for examination; in default the Security Service officer to whom they handed the documents would have to give evidence.

I had a meeting with D.D.G., A. and D. Branches this morning when it was outlined to the meeting what had been discovered by the clandestine search. In short, there had been discovered in the cigarette-box one-time pads, for the sending and receiving, similar to those used by LONSDALE. There was also a diary, on one page of which there was some direction to enable documents to be photographed. It was clear, therefore, that MARTELLI was in possession of all the spy paraphernalia. MARTELLI is presently out of the country and is due to return next week.

2. I said that in my view we had enough evidence to charge MARTELLI with committing an act preparatory to committing an offence under Section 1. I recommended that we should, if the Director of Public Prosecutions agreed, arrest MARTELLI when he arrived back in this country.

3. D.D.G. asked me to see the Director of Public Prosecutions this afternoon. I fixed a meeting with him at 3 o'clock and have arranged with Colonel Winterborn to accompany me to the conference so that he can give an accurate description to the Director of the articles found and we will then obtain the Director's advice.

4. Thereafter, D.D.G. will see Sir Laurence Helsby to acquaint him with the facts of the case and obtain the Government's reactions to a new spy being prosecuted at the present time.

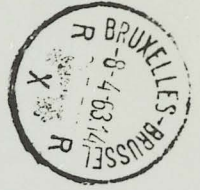

During Operation HORSE BOX I visited Ken Bloomfield in Ward 2, Churchill Hospital, Hedington, Oxford.

2. I first discussed with him the possibility that he would be out of hospital and available to assist with an operation on the afternoon of Wednesday 10 April.* He said that to the best of his knowledge he would be out of hospital on Wednesday morning and should be available to assist. I then agreed with him that I would ring him at Abingdon 1830 at 2 p.m. on Wednesday afternoon and if he was out of hospital we would then arrange to meet in Abingdon.

3. Subject to Bloomfield being available we agreed that we would carry out the following plan. At 5.30. p.m. at a time when the staff would be leaving the premises and the cleaners moving in, I would ring Abingdon 1803 on a wrong number call to check whether Mrs. Martelli was at home. We would then enter the office area under the guise of Bloomfield showing a Civil Engineering friend of his around the new establishment, checking en route at Laboratory G9 and G11 that Martelli's two technicians, Lawrie and Kibbling, together with the Petrovic's, had left the building. We would then proceed to Martelli's room, where I would attempt to remove the sealed package, the diary and the box of cigars, if this appeared to be significant. If the drawer was still locked I would attempt to find the key I had previously used and if this was not available I would try out the set of 12 master keys which we hold for this type of drawer.

4. If the items are found, I will return to the A.2. Lab with the articles, which will be handed to Mr. Hedger and Mr. Catling for examination and repacking.

5. As the establishment closes down for the Easter period at 1 p.m. on Thursday I arranged with Bloomfield that I would return the items to Martelli's desk during the morning at about 12.30 to 1 p.m. when people would be leaving their offices.

In confirmation of Detective Superintendent Fewtrell's telephone message to your Mr. Johnson on Monday, 1st April, 1963, I forward herewith details of the sightings of the above target car in the Slough area on the same day :-

- (1) At 8.50am. on the Bath Road (main A.4) approaching Slough from the west, travelling towards London.
Driver (unaccompanied) :- male, 40-45 years, appeared tall and well built, deep tanned complexion, oval face, dark brown-sleek hair combed straight back, clean-shaven, receding forehead, dark brown eyebrows, large mouth, fairly thick lips, round chin; wearing spectacles; grey suit.

As will be seen the officer who made this sighting had an excellent view and states he would readily recognize this man again.

- (2) At 9am. in Sussex Place (main A.4), Slough on the eastern side of the town, travelling towards London. (Approximately 2 miles from the first sighting).
Driver :- male, 30-40 years; wearing spectacles; light coloured jacket.
Passenger :- seated behind driver; reading a fully opened newspaper held close to the face; sex or description indiscernible.

The officer who made this sighting was facing the opposite direction to the target car and in heavy traffic at the time. He states however, that he got the immediate impression that the passenger was concealing him/herself behind the newspaper.

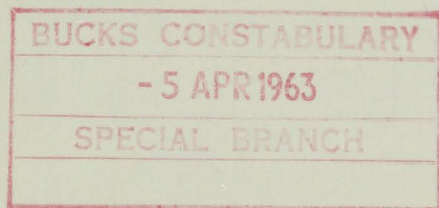

MARTELLI leaves for Calais tomorrow, Thursday, 4th April on the 18.35 car ferry from Southend. In making arrangements for this flight with the A.A. on 28th March, MARTELLI rejected a booking on a plane some two hours earlier, because he had something to do in London which would probably make him too late for it. There are no indications as to what business MARTELLI may have to attend to in London on Thursday. It may quite well be entirely innocent and could, for example, involve (1) a visit to an instrument firm or firms in connection with apparatus required for his laboratory. (We know from [redacted] that he has been in touch with such firms recently.) (2) The collection of his car from the Mercedes-Benz agency on the Great West Road, Brentford. His car was taken in for servicing on Monday and was ready for his collection on Tuesday, but as we learnt from TOW ROPE, he was not in a position to pick it up until Thursday. We have no indication of the time he intends to pick up his car, and this could be in the morning or the afternoon.

2. It is possible that MARTELLI's business in London has an intelligence significance. [redacted] who is on the alert, has no indication so far that MARTELLI has received the £240 that he was expecting as long ago as 16th March. There is, therefore, the possibility that he may collect the money at some time tomorrow. It is not altogether likely that he would have an R/V or clear a D.L.B. in the middle of the week. While it is not likely that he would wish to take £240 or so in cash with him on leaving the U.K., he might well have the opportunity of changing the greater part of this into travellers cheques, and he is certainly likely to spend a considerable amount on his month's holiday. If he does receive the R.I.S. payment tomorrow therefore, he will not need to draw cash or travellers cheques from his bank. (I understand that the current restriction on the amount of currency which may be taken out of the U.K. on any one journey is £50 sterling plus £250 in travellers cheques and foreign currency.)

3. I discussed the case with D.1/R.C.S. It was agreed that A.4. should not be asked to co-operate against MARTELLI tomorrow, unless it was intended to go the whole hog and prepare for a possible arrest. The evidence available seemed insufficient to warrant such a course on balance. Since we had no indication what time MARTELLI was collecting his car, it could happen if A.4. were laid on at the Isleworth Mercedes-Benz agency ^{and} MARTELLI collected his car early in the morning. ~~This could mean~~ that A.4. would have to be behind MARTELLI for the greater part of the day. In these circumstances, whether or not an R/V or D.L.B. was to be involved, it was likely that MARTELLI, given his alertness, would become aware of the fact that he was being followed. It was possible, therefore, that the case might be entirely jeopardised.



4. It was decided that A.4. surveillance would be requested only if a more positive lead were forthcoming, which would indicate either that MARTELLI was due to collect his car by midday, or that he was almost certainly going to have an R/V.

5. In the event of no such positive lead coming to hand, it would be arranged that MARTELLI, among others, should be asked at Southend Airport, how much money he was taking out of the country. His reply to this question, assuming its truthfulness, might assist in comparison with the other evidence in deciding whether or not MARTELLI had received a large sum of money before leaving the U.K.



MARTELLI was to have received on Saturday, 16th March a sum of money amounting to about £240 and we know that he received a similar sum which he collected from somewhere near London on the morning of Saturday, 26th January. These two sums originate from the same source and are believed to be part of his salary from the Russian Intelligence Service.
3. MARTELLI failed to collect the money on Saturday, 16th March, apparently through no fault of his own. (We do not know whether he receives the money - assuming that it is R.I.S. salary - from a direct contact with a Russian Intelligence Officer or from a Dead Letter Box.) He is going to Italy on holiday on Thursday, 4th April and since, to our knowledge, he has not to this day received the £240, it is possible that he may attempt to obtain it on the morning of Saturday, 30th March. (Last weeks operation was based on the assumption that the reserve R.I.S. or D.L.B. would be for one week after 16th March, but since MARTELLI did not move last Saturday, it is possible that the reserve was for a fortnight later.) If MARTELLI does attempt to collect the money on Saturday he will probably do so as on 26th January at some point between Abingdon and the Greater London area - and probably within the latter.
4. I should be grateful therefore if observation may be laid on for Saturday morning, 30th March, to cover MARTELLI's movements from Abingdon and to ascertain if he travels towards London, and in that event, if he carries out a rendezvous or clears a D.L.B. If he is detected in this activity, he should be apprehended by the watchers and

and operation COWBOY laid on only if :

- (1) He is seen to clear and/or fill a D.L.B.
- (2) He is seen in contact with a known *Russian official* Intelligence Officer and something is seen to pass between them.

If MARTELLI is seen to meet an Intelligence Officer and nothing is seen to pass between them, observation should be maintained on the contact and dis-continued as soon as it is over. No arrest is intended in these circumstances. If MARTELLI is seen to meet an unidentified contact, observation should be maintained until the contact is concluded, and then concentrated on housing or otherwise identifying (e.g. by tracing to a car) the unknown contact. Observation on MARTELLI should be withdrawn immediately and observation on the unidentified contact withdrawn as soon as identification is achieved or made possible. Particular attention must of course be paid to precisely what occurs at an R.V. or a D.L.B. and in particular what may pass between MARTELLI and any contact he makes.

5. While the R.V. or D.L.B. is most likely to be situated in the Metropolitan Police district, there is a possibility that it may be within the area of C.C. Bucks or C.C. Berks. COWBOY can be laid on with Special Branch at WHITEHALL 1212, Ext. 114, and with C.C. Berkshire by dialling 999. The COWBOY procedure as such will not be laid on with C.C. Buckinghamshire since there is no time for anyone to visit Aylesbury, but arrangements are being made with the Chief Constable on the telephone for a member of C.I.D./S.B. to stand by on Saturday morning at a given telephone number.

6. MARTELLI may well by now be aware of our interest in him and even that he has been followed in the past. The operation therefore calls for great care and if at any time the watchers believe that MARTELLI has become aware of surveillance, he should be followed no further.

7. In these circumstances :

- (1) MARTELLI should not, as we have agreed, be followed all the way in from Abingdon if he does travel to London. We rely on a system of checkpoints on the two routes he is most likely to take and resort to direct following only when he gets to the Greater London area. This following we have agreed should be carried out by hired cars, while a mounting of checkpoints may be done by A.4 cars.
- (2) If MARTELLI is lost between checkpoints subsequent searching should be carried out by Victor Britain cars.
- (3) If MARTELLI appears during the course of the observation to be making for an R.V. or D.L.B. in an isolated area where close observation becomes difficult the watchers should concentrate first and foremost on keeping out of MARTELLI's sight while doing what they can to limit the possible area within which the R.V. may take place, at the risk of losing their quarry. Detection of MARTELLI at the R.V. may in this case have to be postponed for a subsequent occasion when in the light of what is discovered, tighter surveillance arrangements may be possible.

8. Wireless may be used on the special frequency throughout the operation, but within the London area traffic should be restricted to an absolute minimum.

For the reasons set out at Serial 204a, A.4 surveillance was mounted on MARTELLI on Saturday, 23rd March. Arrangements were made for the co-operation of Special Branch and the Bucks and Berkshire Constabularies in case the A.4 surveillance led to an R.V. or D.L.B. and a consequent arrest. In the event nothing happened and a similar operation has been arranged for Saturday, 30th March. The two operations are similar in character and differ only in that:

- a) the operation on the 23rd was mounted at Westerham, while that of the 30th is to be mounted at Abingdon.
- b) O.P.s are available in Abingdon whereas in Westerham the initial static observation had to be mounted from a stationary car.
- c) a helicopter was made available on the 23rd March but it is not possible to enlist this auxiliary aid again on the 30th.

It was planned to continue the operation on the 23rd throughout the day if this was possible, although it was expected that the R.V. was more likely to take place in the morning than in the afternoon. In fact the operation was called off at 4.15 by A.1. who advised me that A.4 ran the serious risk of exposing themselves if they continued any longer, bearing in mind that they had been in the area since 7 a.m. in the morning, that observation on the house had been mounted from an A.4 car and that MARTELLI had twice been followed into Westerham and back. I accepted his advice and agreed that the risks of continuing outweighed the possible advantages.

The following arrangements have been laid on for Saturday, 30th March.

1. A.4 Surveillance.

Arrangements were made during the course of Friday, 29th March, through the good offices of the Berkshire Police, for A.4 to take up positions in three O.P.s. covering three of the four exits from the Fitzharry's Estate. The fourth exit would be covered by an A.4 van which would also be in radio contact with the three O.P.s. and with the Hampstead Station. The three O.P.s. are three of the four selected a short time ago by A.1.B. and the Berkshire Police for an eventual long term surveillance operation against MARTELLI. The O.P.s. will be manned from 08.00. The aim of the watchers concerned is simply to record and report any movements by MARTELLI which they might see.

Because no helicopter is available it would be risky to follow MARTELLI all the way from Abingdon to London (assuming that the R.V. would be in the London area) even with a number of interchangeable A.4 and Victor Brittain cars. It has been arranged therefore that MARTELLI will only be followed in the Greater London area and that up to that point his movements will be recorded through a number of check points. Four check points will be set up on the two routes into London which MARTELLI might be expected to take, (i.e. the A.40 and the Abingdon/Henley and A.4 roads.) An A.4 car will be stationed at each of these points. In addition, two further check points will be set up at:

- a) the A.40, A.412, A.4020 crossroads, south of Denham (0405)
- b) The road junction A.4/A.403 near Harlington (088769).

Two Victor Brittain cars will cover each of these positions. They would be based at the Police Stations at Uxbridge and Harlington respectively and through the good offices of Chief Inspector Williams of Special Branch, arrangements have been made for the A.4 teams to have a room in each of these Police Stations where they may sit and receive and make telephone calls. (The officers involved at Uxbridge and Harlington are Acting Supt. Burn and the Station Officer, Sergeant Jewell.)

Should MARTELLI be lost between one set of check points and the next, a search will be conducted after a lapse of a period of time generous enough to allow him to travel from one point to the next, with a break for petrol or quick refreshment.

The A.4 and V.B. cars while waiting for MARTELLI will keep a look out for any known Russian cars proceeding in a westerly direction.

A.4 have instructions to follow MARTELLI until he is seen to make an R.V. or fill or clear a D.L.B. Bearing in mind MARTELLI's sensitiveness, they will take the greatest care to avoid attracting MARTELLI's attention and have instructions to break off the observation should there be any danger of it being blown. If an R.V. or D.L.B. clearance is observed, great care will be exercised in observing precisely what transpires. Instructions contained in the brief at Serial 206b were expanded during the course of a briefing meeting. An arrest and operation COWBOY are only to be involved if:

- a) MARTELLI is seen to clear or fill a D.L.B.
- b) He is seen in contact with a known Russian official and something is seen to pass between them.

If MARTELLI meets a known Russian official and nothing passes between them, observation is to be discontinued as soon as the meeting breaks up. If he is seen to meet an unknown contact, observation on MARTELLI is to cease at the end of the meeting and the contact is to be housed or otherwise identified. If MARTELLI is seen to fill a D.L.B., he is to be detained immediately and the D.L.B. inspected and its contents carefully noted. If the A.4 resources available at that moment are sufficient, observation is to be maintained on the D.L.B. for a period of up to two hours. If within that time anyone, whether he is a known Russian official or not, is seen to empty the D.L.B., he is to be detained upon the same basis as MARTELLI. If the D.L.B. is not cleared, its contents are to be removed.

2. Police Co-operation.

If an R.V. or D.L.B. is observed, A.4 instructions are to detain MARTELLI and, if appropriate, his Russian contact, and either persuade them to go to the nearest Police Station, if they know where it is, or to remain where they are until Police assistance arrives. Police can be summoned to the scene of the R.V. or to the nearest Police Station by operation COWBOY. If the R.V. takes place in the M.P.D. the A.4 watchers will telephone WHITEHALL 1212 Extension 114 or 115. This will ensure the despatch to the scene of the nearest squad car. It will also allow Chief Inspector Williams, who will be standing by, to proceed to the scene of the arrest as quickly as possible in order to take over and to conduct a search of MARTELLI and his contact and to question them both. Until such time as a policeman arrives, A.4 have instructions to make sure that neither MARTELLI nor any contact he may make, has any opportunity to destroy any material, films, etc. which he may have in his possession. (In order to warn Special Branch of the possible COWBOY requirement in this case, Director A and I called on Chief Supt.

/Grant....

Grant at Special Branch on Friday, 22nd March. Grant was ready to offer the fullest co-operation and detailed Chief Inspector Williams to take over the Special Branch side of the case. I briefed Williams verbally in my office later in the afternoon. He has since received the written brief at Serial 204a.)

Similar arrangements have been laid on with C.C. Berkshire should the offence take place within his jurisdiction and Supt. Lawson and Sergeant Hearn will be standing by. A COWBOY call to 999 would send both a squad car and Messrs. Lawson and Hearn immediately to the scene of the arrest. Berkshire police were entirely happy that Chief Inspector Williams should take over as soon as he could get to the scene of detention, whether or not the R.V. took place within C.C. Berkshire's area. In either case they were prepared to issue a warrant for the search of MARTELLI's house.

COWBOY arrangements have not been laid on with C.C. Bucks but an arrangement has been made with the Deputy Chief Constable and with Supt. Fewtrell who will be standing by their telephones at Police Headquarters. (Aylesbury 5010). Other arrangements will be exactly similar to those which would operate should the offence take place in Berkshire.

3. A.2 participation.

Mr. Hedger and Mr. Catling will be standing by on Saturday morning. [redacted] will be at home but Messrs. Hedger and Catling will be at their offices. If the COWBOY procedure is laid on, A.4 watchers will telephone control where A.1., A.4/Col. Orlebar and I will be waiting. I would then telephone Williams at Special Branch and arrange to meet him as quickly as possible at the Police Station nearest to the point where the R.V. was held and to which MARTELLI would be conducted. A.4 control would then notify Col. Winterborn and Messrs. Hedger and Catling. [redacted] would drive into Town, pick up the other two and then rendezvous at Abingdon Police Station with a search team which would be despatched by Williams immediately on receipt of COWBOY to that station. This posse would then on receipt of the search warrant conduct a search of MARTELLI's house and his office and laboratory (G.11 and/or G.9) at Culham.

4. A.E.A. participation.

Roger Lees has been warned, as he was before the previous week's operation, that an arrest might possibly take place this Saturday. He has:

- a) warned the Chairman of A.E.A.
- b) arranged for an A.E.A. expert to be available to examine and assess, at least on a preliminary basis, any documents found on MARTELLI or in his office or home, or on the person of a Russian contact. (This individual is John Gillams, Assistant Secretary rank, of the Economics and Programming Branch. Gillams deals with military programmes and has a great deal to do with the classifying of A.E.A. information.)
- c) provide himself with the telephone numbers of Dr. Adams and Willson, the Secretary at Culham. These individuals of course have not been informed in advance that anything is expected to happen.

5. Communications.

Wireless is to be used in all the A.4 and V.B. cars, in the A.4 van and in the three O.Ps. A special frequency will be used and dummy traffic passed on the normal A.4 operating frequency. The O.Ps. and van will be in touch through the latter and the Hampstead station with A.4 control. Check points will be in touch with control by telephone and will ring up at intervals for instructions and, if necessary, for information, and, of course, to make reports.

6. Time of the Operation.

The O.Ps. and check points 1 and 2 will be manned from 08.00, check points 3 and 4 from 08.30 and check points 5 and 6 from 08.45. The operation will be concluded at 12.30 if no movement is seen.

MARTELLI, an Italian national, is a nuclear physicist employed by Euratom whose headquarters are in Brussels. Since November, 1962 he has been attached to the U.K. Atomic Energy Authority Laboratories at Culham near Abingdon, Berkshire, having previously worked in the U.K. from 1956 to April, 1962. He lives on an Atomic Energy Authority Estate at No.14 Fishharry's Road, Abingdon together with his English wife, Pamela née ROTHWELL, a space physicist, their child, Suzanna and a young au pair girl, Hilary MILWARD.

2. MARTELLI has a Communist record which is set out in an appendix attached. We have reason to believe that he is identical with a scientist who according to a hitherto reliable defector source whose information is still of extreme delicacy, has been spying in England on behalf of the Russian Intelligence Service under the control of Nikolai KARPEKOV, who was VASSALL's controller at the time of the latter's arrest. We have no direct evidence of contact between KARPEKOV and MARTELLI. We do know however that KARPEKOV served in Italy from September, 1948 to November, 1955 at a time when MARTELLI was living and working in Rome and Pisa. At this time incidently it was known that the Russian Intelligence Service was engaged in attempting to penetrate Italian Scientific circles and it is possible that MARTELLI was recruited by KARPEKOV at this time. Between 1959 and 1961, while MARTELLI was at Birmingham University KARPEKOV is known to have made three visits to Birmingham. KARPEKOV also visited Brussels from 25th April to 22nd May, 1962. MARTELLI was in Brussels from the 27th April to the 4th May between visits to the U.K., having left his appointment at Birmingham University in April for a post in Euratom. It is possible that KARPEKOV may have visited Brussels at this time in order to hand MARTELLI over to a controller resident in Belgium and it may be significant that he was met at the airport by a Russian diplomat who is believed to be a member of the G.R.U. (KARPEKOV's service is of course the K.G.B. but as far as is known Atomic Energy matters appear to be the preserve of the G.R.U. in Belgium).

3. If MARTELLI is currently spying it is unlikely that he would be passing to his controller classified documents or copies of such documents since he would not have legitimate access to such papers. The work at Culham Laboratories is concerned with controlled thermo-nuclear reaction, or plasma physics, studies and is completely unclassified. A number of people however who work at Culham have

in other capacities, or have had, access to highly classified defence information. Some of these people are employed part-time at Culham and the Weapons Research Establishment at Aldermaston. It is not impossible therefore that MARTELLI may learn much of interest to the Russian Intelligence Service through his association with other scientists who have such access. In addition it is also the case that while it is unclassified the work at Culham is of interest to the Russians. It is therefore anticipated that what material be passed to the R.I.S. would be composed by himself.

4. During the time of his stay in the U.K. on the staff of Birmingham University there were indications that MARTELLI was living above his means. At times of financial crisis he has in the past been able to retrieve the situation in ways which his wife has not always appeared to understand (we believe that she is unconscious of his intelligence role).

5. On the morning of Saturday 26th January MARTELLI obtained from an unknown source a sum of some £240 and he is known to have journeyed by car from Abingdon at least as far as Burnham, Bucks at the beginning of the M.4., and probably further towards London to collect it. He told his wife on that occasion that he was due to receive his next money some time in March. This next payment we now know he was to have received some time on Saturday, 16th March and it was again to have been about £240. For some reason he was unable to collect the money - he told his wife that the man from whom he was to collect it was ill - but he hoped to have it soon. His wife has been led to believe that these monies are sent to him by his brother, Vittore, in Rome and that they derive from his deceased father's estate. His brother is aware of this deception and that MARTELLI in fact enjoys an extra quarterly income in this country.

6. It is believed that these two payments are part of MARTELLI's salary from the Russian Intelligence Service although it is not known whether he receives them direct from a R.I.S. contact or through a dead letter box. If this belief is correct it would seem that the R.I.S. failed to provide the money on Saturday, 16th March and that a reserve R.V. or D.L.B. would have been arranged. It was on the supposition that the reserve would be a week later that the operation against MARTELLI was laid on on Saturday 23rd March - an operation in which you kindly offered your assistance. As you know observation established that MARTELLI did not leave Westerham while he and his wife were staying with the latter's parents on that day.

7. On Thursday, April 4th MARTELLI is leaving for a holiday in Italy. We know that he has not so far received the £240 he was expecting and it is thought likely in the circumstances that he may attempt to collect it on the morning of Saturday 30th March (it is now assumed that the reserve was in fact for a fortnight after the failed R.V), we are therefore arranging surveillance on MARTELLI in Abingdon on Saturday morning next.

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If in the course of the morning he is seen to collect a package from a dead letter box or is seen in contact with a known Intelligence Officer and something is seen to pass between them either way, we would like to have our watchers detain MARTELLI, and if applicable his contact, and put Operation COWBOY into effect. This would require the assistance of Special Branch and we understand that on this occasion also you would be prepared to render it.

8. If MARTELLI is apprehended we should like to have a search made upon his person and his home and office (arrangements have been made for authority to be given for entry into his office). It is hoped that a search of his office will be productive of information confirming his espionage activities. As you know we already have some indication that his office does contain such evidence. Arrangements have also been made for a representative of the Atomic Energy Authority to be available on Saturday to give an assessment of any material which may be found on MARTELLI's person at the time of his arrest or in his house or office.

9. I attach appendixes showing details of the background and security record of MARTELLI and his wife.

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APPENDIX A

MARTELLI'S HISTORY

After service during the war with the Italian Army in the rank of corporal, MARTELLI was engaged in research in nuclear physics, first in the University of Rome and the nearby laboratories of Teste Grigia and subsequently at the University of Pisa, where as a professor he was working in 1951 on the determination of low energy protons. In November 1956, after an unknown period spent in nuclear research somewhere in Germany, he took up a research fellowship at Birmingham University. In October 1958 he was promoted to Staff Fellow in the Physics Department of the University and three years later to a lectureship in Physics. During his stay at Birmingham he had frequent occasion to visit the Imperial College, where his then mistress, Pamela ROTHWELL, was employed. In April 1962, annoyed at failing to secure a further promotion he had been promised, he resigned from the staff of the University and secured a post with Euratom in Brussels. At the time of his resignation he was near the top of his salary bracket, £1,300 plus £100 expenses per annum.

2. In 1961 MARTELLI had secured the annulment of his marriage to Maria VICICH and from that date he and Pamela ROTHWELL, who was by then also working at Birmingham University, have been living together as man and wife. They have a small daughter, but it is not known if they are in fact married. ROTHWELL is known as Mrs. MARTELLI but for professional purposes prefers to retain her maiden name.

3. On MARTELLI's appointment to Brussels ROTHWELL continued to keep up their house in Birmingham and her work at the University. He visited her frequently.

4. In November 1962 MARTELLI began an attachment from Euratom to the U.K. Atomic Energy Laboratories at Culham, near Abingdon. This attachment is now likely to continue for three years. He has moved his family from Birmingham and they now live at 14, Fitzharry's Road, Abingdon. His salary, including allowances, is about £360 per month. Nevertheless the MARTELLIs are worried about their present financial position and are understood to have an overdraft. It is not known how large this is, but it is believed to be substantial. They hope to wipe this out when their Birmingham house is sold and certain arrears of salary come into their possession.

5. One of the financial difficulties facing MARTELLI is the burden of an alimony to his first wife and the support of their two children who are still at school. He is proposing to visit them in Pisa from 4th April next.

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MARTELLI came to our notice in early 1958 when it was reported that he and his mistress Pamela ROTHWELL held markedly left wing views and in the following year an anonymous informant suggested that his political activities before coming to the U.K. might well be looked into.

2. Subsequent investigation revealed that he was reported to have been an active Communist in 1950. He was separately alleged to hold Communist beliefs in 1954 and 1952. In 1955, according to American sources, it was reported that he and his Russian born wife were currently members of the Italian Communist Party and active Communist propagandists, and that in the same year he had subscribed to an appeal of the National Committee of Partisan of Peace - a Communist 'front' organisation. In applying for a visa to the United States in 1960 MARTELLI declared that a previous application in 1955 had been rejected on the grounds of his connexion with the Italian Communist Party, and went on to aver that he had no such connexions. He declared that his only contact with Communists or Communist affiliated organisations related to:-

- (i) His current wife's employment for a few months in 1947 and 1948 as librarian with the Italian Society for Cultural Relations with the U.S.S.R. She was engaged in translation work and he helped her since he was learning Russian. (He was later reported to be proficient in this language).
- (ii) His wife's employment as interpreter for visiting Russian delegations. He assisted her in this also, since she was shy.
- (iii) His own employment in 1948 as interpreter for the Russian delegation to the Venice Film Festival. He claims that he was invited to do this work because of his work in (i) and (ii) above and that he accepted because the pay was good.

3. No further information on MARTELLI's political standing have been received apart from a report dated 1960 that while at Birmingham University he was frequently to be seen in the company of people of left wing sympathies. Current investigations do no more than show that his sympathies are to the left.

- Fathers:** Achille MARTELLI now deceased. A man of some fame, after whom a school and a street in Rome are being named. On his death he left some property to his family. From this, subject has said he benefits to the extent of £600 per annum.
- Mother:** Dr. Annamaria MARTELLI née SANDRI
138 Via Sistina, Rome, and from time to time:
Pensione San Carlo FRASCATI (Rome)
where she looks after her own mother.
- Brothers:** Vittore MARTELLI (wife Simone comes from Nancy in France).
He has just achieved his doctorate in architecture.
- Sister:** Adriana MARTELLI.
- First wife:** Maria née VICIGI, Italian national born of Italian father and White Russian mother (Olga VICIGI LISKA) in Horog, Central Asia. Maria MARTELLI, known to subject as Mussia lives at Viale Gramsci 3, Pisa with the two children of their marriage which was annulled in 1961. This woman and her mother were in the U.K. from December 1958 until 1960.
- Son:** Sergio born 28.2.1948 (by Maria MARTELLI). A schoolboy in Pisa.
- Daughter:** Eleonora born 25.8.1951. (by Maria). Also at school.
- Second and present wife:** Pamela née ROTHWELL. Born 17.5.1926.
Pamela is a scientist whose field is space physics. She has achieved some distinction and sits on the Committee of the European Space Research Organisation. She was MARTELLI's mistress from 1953. It is not clear whether she and MARTELLI are in fact married.
- Daughter:** Suzanna (by Pamela). aged between 2 and 3 years.
- Parents-in-law:** Mr. & Mrs. Percy ROTHWELL of Rysted, Pilgrims Way, Westerham, Kent. Percy ROTHWELL was employed as a physicist at Ford Halstead but is now retired.

July 1960: Employed in Department of Physics University of Iowa, U.S.A.
- May 1961 onwards: Engaged as Research Assistant in the Electron Physics Unit of the Department of Physics at Birmingham University under Professor Sayers. The Electron Physics Unit designed and assembled part of the equipment for British Communications Satellites. Subject has now become eminent in the field of space physics and sits on the committee of the European Space Research Organisation. She has contacts in the National Aeronautics and Space Administration of the United States and has recently attended a N.A.S.A. Symposium at Greenbelt, Maryland. When MARTELLI began his attachment to U.K.A.E.A., Culham in November 1962 his wife left Birmingham to live with him at 14, Fitzharry Road, Abingdon. She still continues her work for Birmingham University on a contract basis for which she receives a salary of about £40 a month.

Security Record:

In 1958 Pamela ROTHWELL and MARTELLI were both reported to hold left wing views. In that year she was reported to have been a great admirer of Bruno PONTECORVO both as a man and as a scientist and to have asserted that it was ridiculous to regard defecting scientists as traitors. She has not otherwise come to adverse notice and there is nothing to indicate that her political views are anything more than socialist.

MARTELLI told Distant that he was returning on approximately 30th April, but did not know when. He did not want the A.A. to charge him for the return, because he had no idea which way he would come back. He did not know whether he would fly from (??France??) (v. indist.).

Distant asked if he was going to Yugoslavia, to which he replied: "Yes". Distant explained that normally the A.A. had to issue a "carnet" for that, but as his car had been imported under a touring document they would not be able to issue this to him. He could get temporary entry forms at the Yugoslavian frontier, and there would be no difficulty in bringing the car back to this Country. He would be issued with another C.112 to bring it back. MARTELLI said that until November he was still exempted from Customs duty.

MARTELLI suggested that as the car was registered in Belgium he could get the necessary document there; Distant thought he probably could. Distant did not know what happened about visas for Yugoslavia, and whether they were issued at the frontier. She promised to find out and ring up about this.

Distant said that she was just about to make the booking for MARTELLI. He had given as his first choice the 4th April, at 16.45, to Calain. The second choice was 18.35 hrs. Southend to Calais. He asked her to reverse the order of these choices; he had something to do in London on Thursday which would take him "two - I might perhaps miss the plane." (The 16.45 apparently leaves from Lydd) 13.57.

At 0700 our main forces, consisting of T.A.C. H.Q. helicopter, 2 A.4 cars and two Victor Britain cars, were concentrating in the Westerham area (4454). The actual disposition of our vehicles was as follows:-

(a) T.A.C. H.Q. helicopter at Col. Winterbourne's house Woodman's Folly, Crockham Hill (4450).

(b) One A.4 car, one V.B. car in Westerham.

(c) One A.4 car at Pilgrims Way at 424556 and a V.B. car at road junction (422556). The A.4 car had a good but long range view of the entrance to Rysted (700 yds.) but was out of view of the actual house. All movement into and out of Rysted could be observed and this A.4 car was the only vehicle that had Rysted or its entrance in view.

2. At 0800 acting as long-stops two V.B. cars were stationed on the North side of the Thames at Vauxhall Bridge and Battersea Bridge. One V.B. car on each bridge.

3. MARTELLI was only seen twice during the whole day. His movements were as follows:-

(a) 10.00 MARTELLI left Rysted in his car accompanied by an elderly man who could have been his father-in-law and a child. MARTELLI drove to Westerham, shopped at the International Stores, and returned to Rysted at 1015.


(b) At 1415 MARTELLI left in his car, drove to Westerham where he did some local shopping, and then returned to his home address at 1430.

4. At each of the above occasions MARTELLI used his car EUR 1957. On neither occasion did the helicopter take off but on the second occasion the helicopter was about to do so when the information was received that MARTELLI had returned to Rysted.

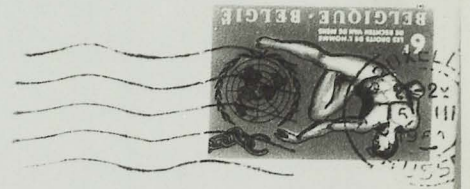



I met Mr. Beith and ^{his} two agents again on Wednesday, 13th March, (See Serial 175b) in connection with the attempt to find a replacement for the MARTELLI's 'au pair' girl. I reported that I had learned that MARTELLI had now secured the services of a Yugoslav girl. It was agreed that there might be a possibility of getting alongside the chosen girl if circumstances were favourable and when she had been identified. It was also agreed that there was a possibility of tackling MARTELLI's char or of inducing her departure and finding a replacement for her.

2. Mr. Beith mentioned that one of his contacts had a friend who lived in Culham and who was a member of the local Observer Corps. On my expressing interest in this contact, Beith ascertained on the telephone that his name was Balmforth, that he was nearly 60 years of age, and that he was a builder - a jobbing builder I believe. It appeared that he did not live in Culham itself but in a place called Milton nearby and that the Culham connection was explained by the fact that he was a member of the Culham Observer Corps. Mr. Beith will find out a bit more about Mr. Balmforth and let me know the details.



The Home Office Warrant operating on MARTELLI's mail indicates that he received on Wednesday, 13th March, a letter addressed to him at Culham from the European Coal and Steel Community. The receipt of this letter may explain MARTELLI's apparently sudden decision to visit London on Thursday, 14th March. * We know already that MACCIOTTI, the Administrator of the European Coal and Steel Community, has had some part to play in MARTELLI's salary negotiations with Euratom. It may therefore be that MARTELLI is proposing to visit MACCIOTTI today.

2. When talking early on Thursday morning with the Mercedes-Benz distributors at Brentford about a replacement door lock for his car, MARTELLI said "Since I am coming down to London I thought I might as.....as well come and collect one." He ended up by saying: "Well then I'll come down this morning on purpose for that.."

3. I think the above is sufficient indication that MARTELLI had to come to London, that Brentford was not on his normal route, but that he would make a detour in order to be able to call in at the Mercedes distributors.





APPENDIX "A".

In his search of MARTELLI's office Mr. Last examined the furniture and containers in the room carefully in order to establish whether there were any hiding places for espionage material. This search was fruitless except in respect of what was found in the bottom right-hand drawer of MARTELLI's desk. This drawer was the only locked container in the room. (The metal cabinet to which we had obtained a duplicate key was left unlocked.)

2. The desk drawer contained, among a number of papers and letters, one of which appeared to be a letter from Christine ROEDIG which PHIDIAS had already shown to us, the following:-

a) A box containing four cigars arranged in a curious position which suggested that they might possibly have been arranged as a trap. They were therefore not disturbed.

b) A small package wrapped with brown paper and heavily secured with cello tape bearing the markings "Personal and Private." This package was in the rear compartment of the locked drawer lying underneath some papers. The package was approximately 5" by 4" and felt as though it contained something like a pocket diary. At one end of the package was what appeared to be a small cardboard box measuring approximately 4" by 1" by $\frac{3}{4}$ ". This cardboard box appeared to contain something solid and roughly the same dimensions.

c) A green coloured/pocket diary. This diary contained at both ends a large number of names and addresses, some of which were already known to me. The address section also bore a number of names and addresses from previous diaries. This diary was passed to me for examination but I had no time to examine it beyond the last part of December 1961. (I began at the most recent date and worked backwards.) The only entries of significance which I saw were for Saturday, 16th December 1961, where the figure 12 had been written in after the date and enclosed in a circle/in writing by "Kings Road, Wimbledon." There was no other entry on this or the adjoining page except on Monday, 11th December, where a small street sketch map appeared. (See Appendix "C"). This corresponds closely to a section of Kings Road, Wimbledon. It seems highly likely that these two entries refer to a rendezvous.

3. In my conversation with MARTELLI I established:

a) That Hilary MILWARD is leaving the MARTELLIS in April to go back to Birmingham. (She is the daughter of a grocery shop owner whom the MARTELLIS used to patronise.) The MARTELLIS have secured a Yugoslav girl student who is in England as a replacement for Hilary.

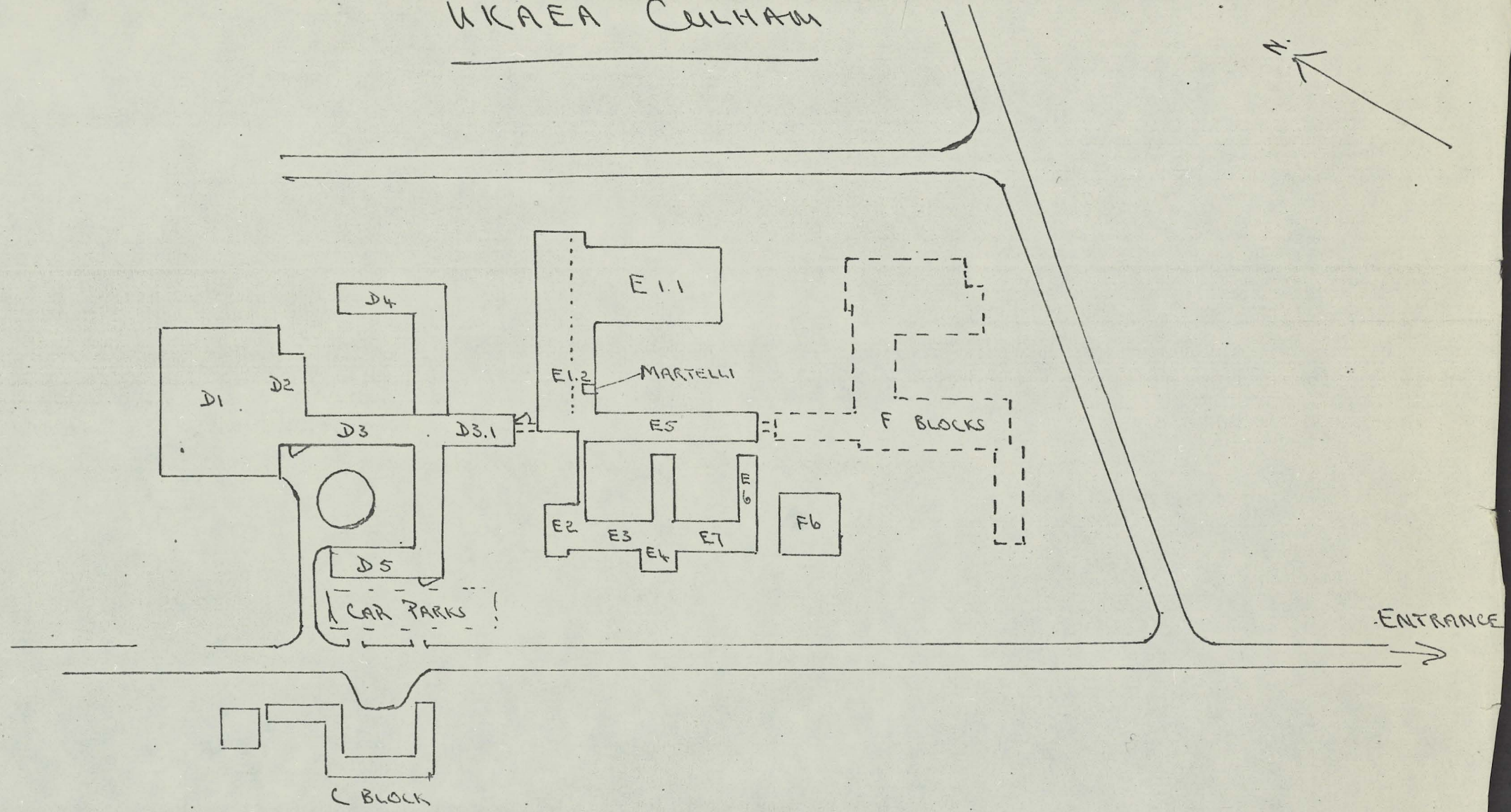
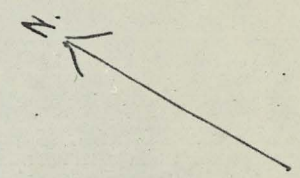

During the operation at Culham on Saturday 9 March I carried out a search of the office with the following results:-

Filing Cabinet.

2. Found to be open. Each drawer contained hanging files. Nothing between or under the files. Files neatly docketed and indexed.

Desk.

3. Bottom right hand drawer locked. This was opened by fiddling with spare key. Contained cigar box with four cigars, green covered 1961 diary with various cryptic entries. These were found in the front compartment.

4. In the rear compartment were 5 or 6 private letters written in a continental hand addressed "Dear G" and a package approximately 5" long 4" wide $\frac{1}{4}$ " thick at one end and 1" thick at the other. By feel it appeared to contain a soft backed notebook and a small cardboard box 4" long 1" wide and $\frac{3}{4}$ " high. The contents were well wrapped in buff paper heavily strapped with sellotape. It was marked "Personell and Private" the word personal being miss spelt.

5. There was no desk diary on the desk.

6. The remaining drawers contained nothing of interest.

7. Full of text books. Jammed between end book and side of book case was card box marked "Bicarbonate of Soda" which contained a white powder.



I visited _____ at his house in Denchworth near Wantage and showed him the accompanying bound documents.* I told him that they had come into my possession because they had been discovered in an insecure place and I had been asked to find out whether they contained any classified or commercial data even though no security grading markings appeared on the documents.

2. After lunch I left _____ in his study reading the documents while I joined _____ we rejoined for tea at 4 o'clock and afterwards he gave me his impressions of the contents of the documents.

3. The work appeared to him to be the text of a book or a collection of data from lectures of a high order of excellence and of original treatment. None of the information is classified or of defence interest, but, just as the collected talks and lectures of the late FERMI would be of scientific value to scientists throughout the world but are unavailable, so this work would be of value scientifically to others.

4. Broadly the text is separated into (a) a rough draft and (b) the finished draft resulting from the corrections appearing in (a).

5. Because of the wording of the text (ommission of prepositions), _____ of the opinion that the work of (a) and (b) etc. is that of a foreigner (possibly an Indian or a Russian). He knows, for instance, that Professor BHA BHA of Indian A.E.C. is interested in the subject of plasma. _____ continued by saying the corrections might be those of W. B. THOMPSON or somebody of equal standing. I was surprised that this name should have been mentioned by him without any lead in from me.



Peter Irwin told me that the only Atomic Energy Authority establishment in the Amersham/Aylesbury area is the Radiochemical Centre at Amersham. The main business of this establishment is the production of Isotopes for commercial use. The work is unclassified, although a certain small amount of classified information is available to the Director and some of the Senior Assistants.

Irwin told me that on the face of it, there appears to be no connection between MARTELLI's work and that of the Radiochemical Centre. He will make enquiries on this point and revert.



Pamela MARTELLI, nee ROTHWELL

I confirm that Pamela MARTELLI, who for professional purposes prefers to retain her maiden name of ROTHWELL, will probably be going to the United States shortly to take part in a symposium to be held at the Goddard Space Flight Centre, Greenbelt, Maryland, under the auspices of the National Aeronautic and Space Administration. Miss ROTHWELL has achieved some eminence in the field of space physics and is on the Committee of the European Space Research Organisation. She is in touch with members of the staff of N.A.S.A. and in particular with W.N. HESS, the Chief of the Theoretical Division at Greenbelt, and Frank McDONALD, also of the Goddard Centre. Both HESS and McDONALD saw a great deal of the MARTELLIS when they were in England at the end of last year. McDONALD is particularly friendly with them and it is highly likely that if Pamela ROTHWELL did go to the United States she would stay with the McDONALDS at 10702 Glenwild Road, Silver Spring, Maryland.

I now understand that Pamela ROTHWELL is hoping to fly to the United States on Monday next, 11th March, and to return on Friday, the 15th, to the U.K.

I confirm that Pamela ROTHWELL's security record is confined to her association with MARTELLI, her admiration for PONTECORVO, under whom she worked, and the fact that she is known to have held left-wing political views. The indications are that she is not involved in her husband's espionage activities or even aware of them.

We do not ask for any special attention to be paid to Pamela ROTHWELL during her stay in the United States. We should, however, be interested to know, in so far as this may emerge, what contacts she makes during her stay. Our interest in this point springs from the fact that she may pick up information from those she meets which she may pass on, with not necessarily sinister intent, to her husband.

I send you herewith three copies of Pamela ROTHWELL's photograph (dated 1957).
