THE QUEEN'S VISIT TO GCHQ

Many thanks for telling me, in your letter of 2 March, of Robin Janvin's approach over the forthcoming visit to GCHQ. I would put the point more strongly than even you have done. Cancellation of the visit would produce not just widespread disappointment amongst GCHQ staff and their families, but would inevitably give rise to public controversy over the reasons for the non-appearance of the Sovereign at such a long planned event. The fact that the visit is a very well guarded secret so far should not lead us to imagine that cancellation would not result in someone talking out of turn. The story would also no doubt be put around that it was HMG that advised Her Majesty not to attend, and that would no doubt give rise to much undesirable speculation about Ministers' attitudes to interception after the Clare Short revelations and the Gun affair.

All that said, Her Majesty can be assured of a very warm welcome amidst some of her most loyal subjects.

I am copying this letter to Ivan Rogers, David Pepper and Matthew Kidd.
