Overall volunteering satisfaction is very high — up on previous years																			
 96% of responders rating 4 or 5 out of 5 (with over 50% rating 5/5 'excellent') This compares with 90% in 2019 (note no comparable survey ran in 2020) 																			
 In particular, specific elements with particularly high satisfaction included the support provided and interest/understanding of the projects being worked on: 																			
 97% satisfaction: "Support provided by your supervisor when you need it" 97% satisfaction: "Interest in the topic of the project" 95% satisfaction: "Clear understanding of the purpose and value of the outcome of a project" 											it"
